  - Number/Percent received (GMDC) – 939/96.2%

- Specialized Training - For its specialized housing units (Second Chance, TRU, and Secure) DOC will be providing additional training to include the following:
  - 2-day collaborative training (DOC and H&H) – focusing on DOC programming strategy, 14-point agenda, youth development, trauma, behavior modification principles, and unit protocols
    - The first collaborative training was held by DOC’s Department of Youthful Offender Programming and H + H for Second Chance and TRU staff members steadily assigned to these units on October 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>. A total of 32 individuals attended this training (22 uniformed staff and 10 non-uniformed staff). Training for December is currently being scheduled. The Department will provide additional information about training attendance in the January report.
  - 1-day overview of Dialectical Behavior Therapy and programming strategies (to begin in December 2017 in Second Chance and TRU)
    - Training for December is currently being scheduled. The Department will provide additional information about training attendance in the January report.

The Department will begin providing these trainings to young adult-only ESH housing units after they have been implemented in Second Chance, TRU, and Secure.
