

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









Number and Percent of Patients with Confirmed COVID-19 November 28 - December 4, 2020




Number of Currently Incarcerated Patients with Confirmed COVID-19 March 17 - December 4, 2020









Percentage of People in Custody in Housing Areas with a COVID-19 Designation




Number and Percent of Open Cell and Dorm Units Above and Below 50% Capacity December 3, 2020


Number and Percent of Open Units Above and Below 50% Capacity by Housing Category December 3, 2020
