i. **Average Daily Population**

**ii. Number of Young Adults Placed:**

Second Chance Housing (SCH)

During the reporting period, ten (10) young adults were placed in SCH.

Transitional Restorative Unit (TRU)

During the reporting period, twenty-five (25) young adults were placed in TRU.

Secure Unit

During the reporting period, three (3) young adults were placed in Secure Unit.

Enhanced Supervision Housing (ESH)

During the reporting period, seven (7) young adults were placed in ESH.

**iii. Number of Young Adults Released:**

Second Chance Housing (SCH)

During the reporting period, seven (7) young adults were released from SCH.

Transitional Restorative Unit (TRU)

During the reporting period, fifteen (15) young adults were released from TRU.

Secure Unit

During the reporting period, two (2) young adults were released from Secure Unit.

Enhanced Supervision Housing (ESH)

During the reporting period, three (3) young adults were released from ESH.

**iv. The number of young adults who had a previous placement(s) in ESH, TRU, Second Chance, or the Secure Unit, other than a step-down from TRU or Secure Unit during their current incarceration:**

During this reporting period, there were twenty-five (25) young adults who met this criteria:

- Second Chance: During the reporting period six (6) young adults placed in SCH had a previous placement(s) in TRU, Second Chance, ESH, or Secure Unit.
- TRU: During the reporting period thirteen (13) young adults placed in TRU had a previous placement(s) in TRU, Second Chance, ESH, or Secure Unit.
- Secure Unit: During the reporting period two (2) young adults placed in Secure Unit had a previous placement(s) in TRU, Second Chance, ESH, or Secure Unit.
- ESH: During the reporting period four (4) young adults placed in ESH had a previous placement(s) in TRU, Second Chance, ESH, or Secure Unit.

**v. The number of young adults who met the criteria for a timely case review;**

All young adults placed in Second Chance and TRU receive their first Support Team review after being in the unit for two weeks. From that point forward, the young adults receive weekly Support Team reviews. All young adults placed in the Secure Unit receive weekly Support Team reviews.

During the reporting period, one hundred fifty-six (156) young adults met the criteria for case reviews:

- Second Chance: Forty-five (45) young adults met the criteria for case reviews.
- TRU: Eighty-six (86) young adults met the criteria for case reviews.
- Secure Unit: Eight (8) young adults met the criteria for case reviews.
- ESH: Seventeen (17) young adults met the criteria for case reviews.

**vi. The number of young adults who received such review;**

During the reporting period, one hundred fifty-five (155) young adults received case reviews:

- Second Chance: Forty-five (45) young adults received their case reviews.
- TRU: Eighty-six (86) young adults received their case reviews.
- Secure Unit: Eight (8) young adults received their case reviews.
- ESH: Sixteen (16)<sup>2</sup> young adults received case reviews.

**vii. The number of reviews that resulted in placement in an alternative housing area:**

During the reporting period, fifteen (15) young adults received case reviews that resulted in their placement in an alternative housing area:

- Second Chance: Five (5) young adults were placed in an alternative housing area as a result of their case review.
- TRU: Ten (10) young adults were placed in an alternative housing area as a result of their case review.
