Description: Commercial top-load washing machines for use in coin laundries or non-coin institutional laundries. The machines are manufactured with either an electronic processor or a mechanical timer, and are operated with non-pay, coin pay or card reader operation.

Note: The units shall be provided with a vacuum breaker or air gap as per Reference Standard RS 16, Section P104.12 of New York City Building Code.

Terms and Conditions: The above-described washing machines are accepted with the following conditions:

1. Machines shall be installed in conformance with Reference Standard RS 16 of the New York City Building Code.
2. Approval of all electrical equipment, apparatus, materials and devices shall be obtained from the Department's Electrical Advisory Board before installation.
3. Units shall be used in compliance with the Energy Conservation Construction of New York State.
4. All shipments and deliveries of such equipment shall be provided with a metal tag, suitably placed, certifying that the equipment shipped or delivered is equivalent to that tested and accepted for use, as provided in Section 27-131 of the Building Code.

Note: In accordance with Section 27-131(d), all materials tested and accepted for use shall be subject to periodic retesting as determined by the Commissioner; and any material which upon retesting is found not to comply with Code requirements or the requirements set forth in the approval of the Commissioner shall cease to be acceptable for the use intended. During the period for such retesting, the Commissioner may require the use of such material to be restricted or discontinued if necessary to secure safety.
