Subject: Fees - C26-34.0 Administrative Code - Search Inspections

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For the purpose of uniformity in the calculation of fees for search inspections required by Section C26-34.0 Administrative Code, the following criteria is to be followed to determine the "frontage" and "depth" of buildings.

(1) The depth of a building is to be measured at curb level and where the depth of the building as measured perpendicular to the street line varies or has different depths, the greatest depth is to be used for the fee computation.

(2) The frontage of a building is to be measured at curb level and the frontage used for fee computation is to be the greatest width of the building measured parallel to the street line.

(3) For buildings fronting on two or more streets, the larger of the building frontages as determined in (2) above is to be considered the depth for fee computations and the smaller of the building frontages is to be considered the frontage for fee computations.

(4) Where the depth and frontage of a building cannot be readily determined as required by paragraphs (1), (2) or (3) above, the same general principles used in these paragraphs is to be followed.
