Timothy E. Hogan serves as the Deputy Commissioner of Enforcement in the New York City Department of Buildings since 2012. With more than three decades of law enforcement experience, Deputy Commissioner Hogan oversees the Department's Enforcement Division, including all emergency and safety operations, complaint inspections and construction accident investigations.

Deputy Commissioner Hogan understands the importance of public safety and the need to consistently evaluate and improve operations. He manages 34 units and handles construction safety, construction complaints, accident response and investigation, Continuity of Operations and major disaster assessment and response. Deputy Commissioner Hogan also assists in the investigation of unethical business practices and unsafe construction work that warrants criminal prosecution.

During his career, Deputy Commissioner Hogan developed an expertise in building security, blast mitigation and emergency management, including security consultation for five courthouse construction projects. He previously served as the Chief Deputy United States Marshal for the Eastern District of New York where he was responsible for the protection of the federal judiciary, threat investigations, criminal investigations, building security, fugitive apprehension, prisoner custody, asset management, and fiscal integrity.

A native of Medford, Massachusetts, Deputy Commissioner Hogan attended Saint Anselm College in Manchester, NH where he obtained a Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice and a certification in Secondary School Education.
