Ground Signs and Illuminated Signs

In regard to the questions posed in your letter of May 19, 1976, regarding the appropriate fees for ground signs, you are advised as follows:

1. Work permit fees in conformance with section C26-32.0, subdivision 2, shall be required to be paid.
2. When the ground sign is both illuminated, and partly or wholly projecting beyond the street line, an additional fee in conformance with the appropriate paragraph (4,5, or 6) of subdivision six of section C26-32.0 shall also be paid before a work permit can be issued; and, is payable annually thereafter.
3. When the ground sign is not subject to item #2 above, an additional fee is required in conformance with paragraph (1) of subdivision six of section C26-32.0, regardless of whether the sign projects beyond the street line or not.

This information is being forwarded to all borough offices for their advise and guidance.

I trust the above information has been of assistance to you.
