**TOMORROW: CCRB to Hold Emergency Meeting on Failure of NYPD
Members, Unions to Participate in Investigations**

More than 500 investigations of police misconduct at a standstill due to NYPD unions' and members' refusal to cooperate

New York, NY – The Civilian Complaint Review Board (CCRB) will hold an emergency public Board meeting tomorrow regarding NYPD unions' and their members' refusal to participate in lawful investigations into recent complaints of misconduct.

There are over 1,100 complaints that have not received a corresponding officer interview, an important part of the CCRB's investigative process. This amounts to more than 500 investigations put on hold pending an officer interview – a number that could grow as more complaints enter the investigative stage at which an officer interview is conducted.
