



The NYC Conflicts of Interest Board (COIB) enforces and interprets the city's conflicts of interest laws and rules that apply to elected officials and city employees, including rules related to volunteering, gifts, and political activity. All five members of the board are appointed by the Mayor.



Proposals:

Replace two members with one appointed by the Comptroller and one appointed by the Public Advocate, and require that board decisions be approved by at least three members.

Prohibit members of the COIB from participating in campaigns for local elected office, and reduce the amount of money that members can contribute each election cycle to a maximum of \$400 (or less, depending on the office).
