



**MINUTES FOR THE SEPTEMBER 12, 2018 HEARING OF THE  
NEW YORK CITY CHARTER REVISION COMMISSION 2019**

A duly noticed meeting of the New York City Charter Revision Commission 2019 was held in the Lovinger Theatre at Lehman College in the Bronx, at 6:00pm on September 12, 2018.

The Commission held a public hearing during which it heard testimony from the public concerning any comments, proposals and recommendations for possible revisions to the New York City Charter.
