Siyovush Ochilov (“Respondent”) acknowledges receipt of notice from the New York City Department of Consumer Affairs (the “Department”) that, from **2012-2013**, Respondent violated the New York City Administrative Code (the “Code”) Sections 20-259(a) and (c) by operating a pedicab on numerous occasions in a public park in violation of the rules of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law. Pursuant to the Code Section 20-257(f), the Department may refuse to renew a pedicab driver license on this basis. Respondent has applied for the renewal of his pedicab driver license. Respondent consents to this Consent Order (“CO”) to resolve the violations.

Renewal of License

- 1. The Department will renew Respondent’s pedicab driver license subject to the conditions set forth in this CO.

Duty to Comply with Law

- 2. As a pedicab driver, Respondent, shall strictly and promptly comply with Chapter 1 of the Code, beginning at Section 20-101 (known as the License Enforcement Law); Chapter 2, Subchapter 9, Section 20-257 *et seq.* of the Code (known as the Pedicab Driver Licensing Law); Chapter 5, Subchapter 1, Section 20-700 *et seq.* of the Code (known as the Consumer Protection Law); 6 RCNY Section 5-01 *et seq.* (known as the Consumer Protection Law Rules); Chapter 2, Subchapter GG of 6 RCNY (known as the Pedicab License Rules); and this CO.

Illinois Driver History Abstract

3. One hundred days after the execution of this CO, and every ninety days thereafter, Respondent shall submit to the Department an Illinois Driver History Abstract that has been certified by the Illinois Secretary of State within the preceding ten business days.
4. If Respondent fails to provide the Department with the certified Illinois Driver History Abstract by the deadlines established in paragraph three, Respondent's pedicab driver license will be automatically revoked, and Respondent may not apply for a new license for an additional year.

Probation

5. From the date of signing this CO until the end of the 2014 pedicab driver license term, April 30, 2015, Respondent will be on probation.
6. If Respondent accrues five (5) or more summonses or notices during the 2014 pedicab driver license term, probation will be extended until Respondent has received dispositions for all summonses or notices received during that term.
7. If Respondent is found guilty of the charges alleged in five or more of the summonses or violations received during the probationary period, Respondent's pedicab driver license will be automatically revoked, and Respondent may not apply for a new license for an additional year.

Reporting Requirements

8. If Respondent is arrested, or receives a summons or complaint for a traffic-related offense or other notice of violation of any law or regulation, while operating a pedicab, Respondent shall provide to the Department a copy of such summons, complaint or notice of violation within five (5) business days of receipt.
9. If there is a new hearing date for the summons or complaint or notice of violation Respondent shall provide the new hearing date to the Department within five (5) business days of the granting of a new hearing date.

10. Respondent shall obtain a copy of the disposition of every such arrest, summons, complaint, or notice of violation and provide it to the Department within five (5) business days of receipt of such disposition.
11. When reporting to the Department, Respondent shall submit the Pedicab Driver Reporting Form, which is attached to this agreement as Schedule A.
