







Use Group 8 - uses subject to additional conditions

For #uses# denoted with a "P" in Section 32-181 (Use Group 8 – general use allowances), the following provisions shall apply:

- (a) Motion picture theaters, in a new or existing #building# in C1-5, C1-6, C1-7, C1-8, C1-9, C2-5, C2-6, C2-7, C2-8, C4-5, C4-6, C4-7, C5, C6 and C8-4 Districts, shall provide a minimum of four square feet of waiting area within the #zoning lot# for each seat in such theater in order to prevent obstruction of #street# areas. The required waiting space shall be either in an enclosed lobby or open area that is covered or protected during inclement weather and shall not include space occupied by stairs or space within 10 feet of a refreshment stand or of an entrance to a public toilet. Such requirements shall not apply to any additional motion picture theater created by the subdivision of an existing motion picture theater.









What authorizes the DEP to make this rule? Section 1043 of the City Charter and sections 24-105 and 24-163 of the Administrative Code authorize DEP to make this proposed rule. This proposed rule was not included in DEP's regulatory agenda for this fiscal year.

Where can I find DEP's rules? DEP's rules are in Title 15 of the Rules of the City of New York.

What rules govern the rulemaking process? DEP must meet the requirements of section 1043(c) of the City Charter when creating or changing rules. This notice is made according to the requirements of section 1043(b) of the City Charter.

Statement of Basis and Purpose

Section 24-163 of the Air Pollution Control Code (Air Code) prohibits the idling of a motor vehicle for more than three minutes while it is stopped, standing or parked, unless the vehicle is "adjacent" to a school property, in which case, under subdivision (f), idling is limited to one minute.

On May 12, 2023, Local Law 58 of 2023 was enacted. This law extends the one-minute prohibition to vehicles adjacent to or within "any park under the jurisdiction of the [Parks Department]", and directs DEP to promulgate a rule to define "adjacent" for this purpose.

DEP is proposing this rule to implement Local Law 58.

Section 39-02 of Title 15 of the Rules of the City of New York currently defines "adjacent" for purposes of the existing law relating to school property. This definition states: "Adjacent' shall mean on each and every street on which a school is located and has entrances and/or exits to such street..."

DEP proposes to repeal this definition and replace it with a single definition of "adjacent" that will apply to vehicles that are parked, stopped, or standing in proximity to either a school or park property

The proposed rule provides that an idling vehicle is adjacent to school or park property when any part of such vehicle is in a lane of traffic that abuts park or school property and when any part of the vehicle itself abuts such property. This definition, which is illustrated by a diagram, provides a clear and objective standard. It is also as close as possible to the dictionary definition of "adjacent", which is "very near, or with nothing in between". DEP is undertaking an environmental review as required by CEQR to evaluate the potential impact of the establishment of the definition of "adjacent".

New material is <u>underlined</u>. Deleted material is shown in [brackets].

The text of the proposed rule follows.

Section 1. Section 39-02 of Chapter 39 of Title 15 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

§ 39-02 Adjacent to Any Public or Non-Public School <u>or Any Park</u>
<u>Under the Jurisdiction of the New York City Department of Parks and Recreation</u>.

["Adjacent" shall mean on each and every street on which a school



is located and has entrances and/or exits to such street. School shall include any building or structure, playground, athletic field or other property that is part of the school.]

(a) Adjacent. A motor vehicle is adjacent to any public or non-public school or any park under the jurisdiction of the New York city department of parks and recreation when: (i) such vehicle is parked, stopped, or standing within a lane of traffic that abuts park or school property; and (ii) any part of such motor vehicle abuts school or park property. A lane of traffic includes through traffic lanes, bus lanes, all forms of bike lanes, turning bays, parking areas, and shoulders.

(b) Example.

- (1) In this example, vehicles 1a, 1b, & 1c are not adjacent to the school or park property. Vehicle 1a is not adjacent because it is parked across the street from school or park property and therefore is not within a lane of traffic that abuts school or park property. Vehicle 1b is not adjacent because although it is within a lane of traffic that abuts school or park property, no part of the vehicle itself abuts school or park property. Vehicle 1c is not adjacent because it is separated from the school or park property by non-school or non-park property.
- (2) In this example, Vehicle 2a and 2b are adjacent to the school or park property. Vehicle 2a is adjacent to the school or park property because the vehicle is within a lane of traffic that abuts the school or park property and part of the vehicle itself abuts such school or park property. Vehicle 2b is adjacent because it is within a lane of traffic that abuts the school or park property and the vehicle itself fully abuts such school or park property.

January 25, 2024

WHEREAS, on September 2, 2021, the federal monitor in the *Nunez* use-of-force class action stated steps must be taken immediately to address the conditions in the New York City jails; and

WHEREAS, on June 14, 2022, the federal court in *Nunez* approved the *Nunez* Action Plan, which "represents a way to move forward with concrete measures now to address the ongoing crisis at Rikers Island"; and

WHEREAS, while there has been improvement in excessive staff absenteeism, the Department of Correction's (DOC's) staffing levels continue to contribute to a rise in unrest and disorder and create a serious risk to the necessary maintenance and delivery of sanitary conditions; access to basic services including showers, meals, visitation, religious services, commissary, and recreation; and prompt processing at intake; and

WHEREAS, this Order is given to prioritize compliance with the Nunez Action Plan and to address the effects of DOC's staffing levels, the conditions at DOC facilities, and health operations; and

WHEREAS, additional reasons for requiring the measures continued in this Order are set forth in Emergency Executive Order No. 140; and

WHEREAS, the state of emergency existing within DOC facilities, first declared in Emergency Executive Order No. 241, dated September 15, 2021, and extended by subsequent orders, remains in effect;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the powers vested in me by the laws of the State of New York and the City of New York, including but not limited to the New York Executive Law, the New York City Charter and the Administrative Code of the City of New York, and the common law authority to protect the public in the event of an emergency:

Section 1. I hereby direct that section 1 of Emergency Executive Order No. 547, dated January 20, 2024, is extended for five (5) days.

 \S 2. This Emergency Executive Order shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect for five (5) days unless it is terminated or modified at an earlier date.
