Last Friday I was honored to join with the National Park Service, the Jamaica Bay-Rockaway Conser-Parks vancy (JBRPC). and the Fund for

the City of New York to cut the ribbon on the newly completed Living Shoreline at West Pond in the Jamaica Bay Wildlife Refuge, Gateway National Recreation Area.

The restoration project uses natural features to create a soft protective edge that will limit erosion and protect West Pond and the adjacent loop trail. Newly placed sand and native plantings will act as wave attenuators, safeguarding these vital freshwater wetlands while

creating a new, much-needed tidal wetland. The protective berm around West Pond was breached during Superstorm Sandy and subsequently repaired in 2017. Another breach would eliminate a freshwater wetland system that supports a high diversity of bird species within Jamaica Bay. For more photos of the project and the ribbon cutting, visit Flickr.

The restoration project, which cost \$4 million and was funded entirely by DEP, began May 17 and was completed earlier this month. The living shoreline was designed by Dirtworks Landscape Architecture PC, Rippled Waters Engineering and Great Ecology, with collaboration from community stakeholders including the Jamaica Bay Ecowatchers, the American

### **Spotlight on Safety**

As we enter the second holiday season of the pandemic, it is important to continue to take precautions to gather safely. Remember these safety tips:

- if sick, avoid preparing food
- wash hands frequently when handling food
- do not share cups, plates, and silverware
- keep raw meat and eggs away from fresh produce and other foods that do not need to be cooked
- use separate cutting boards, cooked and cooked meats to tion for more information.

avoid cross-contamination: clean up after cooking

- keep cold foods cold (40 F or below) and hot foods hot (165 F for most foods): use a food thermometer to make sure meat is cooked to a safe temperature
- refrigerate leftovers within two hours of being served
- leftovers are safe for 3-4 days when refrigerated
