The New York City Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) protects public health and the environment by supplying clean drinking water, collecting and treating wastewater, and reducing air, noise, and hazardous materials pollution.

We provide a billion gallons of water and treat 1.3 billion gallons of wastewater for nine million New Yorkers every day. Over the next 10 years we plan to invest \$14 billion in infrastructure and other projects to improve our city.

Join the movement that's improving our community and keeping our waterways clean for wildlife. We'll send you a free text message alert* when there's a heavy storm and another when it's all clear.



an easy way to be a hero

You can be a hero and help keep our waterways clean for our community and wildlife. And it's super easy. All you need to do is wait to use water until after the heavy storm.

When there's heavy rain, rest the drain. We're not asking you to wait every time it rains, only when we get those crazy, heavy New York City downpours. So, most of the time you can carry on as normal.



the perfect storm

We all need to use water every day. But when there's a heavy storm and heavy household water usage, our sewers can reach capacity. When this happens, a mix of stormwater and wastewater can end up in our waterways.

Think of it like rush hour on the freeway: there's only so much road and when everyone's trying to use it at the same time it can get jammed. And just like rush hour, the smartest thing to do is avoid it.
