I live on Sterling Place, between Schenectady Avenue and Troy Avenue in Brooklyn. I'm very active in my block association, and we often find the need to reach out to our Councilmembers for support.

But my house, on the odd-numbered side of the street, is within CD 36. My across-the-street neighbors, but on the even-numbered side of the street, are in CD 35.

I'm stymied as to why the boundaries would be drawn with two CDs on one block? It is counter-conducive to our block coming together in community. And silly to split City CD resources this way.

I would very much appreciate:

1. information on *WHY* the lines would be drawn this way
2. specific details on how we might get this changed, so that all residents on our block would be within the same CD.
