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INTRODUCTION

Making a safe and successful return back to the community can be challenging. Fortunately, you do not have to navigate this journey alone. There are many organizations throughout the five boroughs that provide reentry support.

Understanding what community-based services would be most helpful to you is an important element of making a successful return home. This resource booklet has contact information for organizations that provide a wide array of support services to help ease your transition. The providers are listed by borough and according to the specific services they offer, which includes assistance with housing, employment, education, mental health, substance use, benefits, immigration, and legal issues.

By taking advantage of available reentry resources following your release not only do you increase the likelihood of making a safe return home, you also establish a strong foundation of support that will help you become self-sufficient, reach important goals and reestablish bonds with your family, neighbors and loved ones.

Please utilize this booklet to locate critical reentry services. We also encourage you to participate in jail-based programming so you can receive support during your incarceration and after you return home.

WIC sites provide vouchers that can be used at neighborhood stores to buy WIC food which include milk, juice, cheese, and baby formula. Eligibility criteria is outlined on their website.

VOTER REGISTRATION

Person(s) formerly incarcerated in New York State may register or vote in any election if the following is applicable:

- The individual has not been currently convicted on felony charges
- The individual is currently convicted on misdemeanor charges
- The individual has been pardoned or restored to the rights of citizenship by the Governor
- · Maximum sentence of imprisonment has expired

Executive Order 181 grants parolees a conditional pardon that will restore voting rights. Parolees must consult with the NYS Department of Corrections and Community Supervision for information on eligibility. For parolees that do not know their status, they can still fill out their forms and the BOE can check their status.

Homeless residents are allowed to vote. Locations must be as specific as possible, such as "Bench in Central Park on 86th St." Mail addresses should be where mail can be received such as a shelter or P.O. Box.

BAIL PAY

<u>Note:</u> DOC does not provide change from bail transactions. Exact change is required. Acceptable forms of payment include:

- U.S. cash in the exact amount
- Cashier's/Teller's check in any amount not exceeding the bail figure
- Money orders from: the Bank, Federal Express, U.S. Postal Service, Travelers Express Company, and Western Union (multiple money orders are acceptable).
- Credit or Debit card. A processing fee will apply to all credit card transactions.
