<sup>1</sup> Education is self-reported on the intake Risk Screening Form when individuals come into DOC custody. Because an individual has the option whether or not to provide such information, the data captured does not accurately represent the incarcerated population's general educational background. Council may seek further information from the Department of Education for education background on individuals in custody from ages 18-21.
