The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene hereby issues Addendum 3 to the above-referenced Invitation for Bids. Deleted passages are indicated with strike-through marks; added passages are underlined. The bid documents are hereby modified as follows:

A. The first paragraph of Section II.E. is revised as follows:

The Contractor shall perform all work between the hours of 9:00 am and 5:00 pm, Mondays through Fridays, excluding City holidays as listed below, unless prior written approval of the Department is obtained to work different hours. Overtime hours shall apply only for work requested and authorized by DOHMH for performance outside of normal working hours (i.e. 9:00 am to 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday only) and on weekends and holidays. For all such allowable overtime hours required by DOHMH, hourly rates for work performed shall be paid to the Contractor in an amount equal to the hourly rate bid plus the difference between the hourly rate contained in the bid sheet and the overtime or holiday rate required for each such applicable title under the applicable Prevailing Wage Rate schedule ~~based upon one and one-half times the rates bid for regular hours.~~ in accordance with the applicable Prevailing Wage schedule that is in effect at the time work is performed. All scheduling of the work shall be at DOHMH's sole discretion

There are no other changes to this Section. The listing of holidays will remain as is.

B. Section II.G. (General Conditions) is revised to add the following provisions:

Prevailing Wages

21. The work stipulated herein involves titles covered by prevailing wage rates pursuant to New York State Labor Law Section 220. Contractor shall be required to pay not-less-than the prevailing wage and supplemental benefits rates in effect at the time

work is performed. Current prevailing wage rate schedules may be found at the following website: <http://www.comptroller.nyc.gov/bureaus/bll/schedules.shtm>

The Contractor is charged with having full knowledge and responsibility for the payment of applicable prevailing wages and supplemental benefits.

Requirements Contract

22. Quantities of goods and/or services either specified or implied herein are estimates only. The Contractor will be paid only for the actual time and/or materials that are utilized, whether more or less than the estimated amounts.

C. Section III.M. is hereby revised as follows:

1. DOHMH anticipates that there will be no subcontracting permitted on any contract, which may result from this solicitation.
- ~~1. Documents given to a sub-contractor for the purpose of soliciting the sub-contractor's bid shall include either a copy of the bid cover or a separate information sheet setting forth the project name, the contract number (if available), the contracting agency, and the project's location.~~
- ~~2. If a bidder intends to sue sub-contractors in the performance of this contract, the bidder must, to the extent known, provide a list of such sub-contractors, including a statement of work to be assigned to each sub-contractor. Such information must be provided with the Bid Package. See Section IV.~~
- ~~3. Subcontractors must comply with the submission requirements for the Vendex Questionnaires and Employment Report.~~

D. Section IV is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the attached page, entitled: "Section IV: BID PACKAGE"

E. The Cover Sheet/Checklist contained in Section IV is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the attached page, entitled: "Cover Sheet / Checklist." Bidders are instructed to use and attach this version of the Cover Sheet / Checklist to their bid submission.

F. Section IV Item 2 is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the attached page, entitled: "Item 2: Bid Sheet." Bidders are instructed to use this version of the Bid Sheet to record their bids.

G. Section IV Item 5 is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the attached page, entitled: "Item 5".

H. Appendix C is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the attached page, entitled: "Appendix C".

I. Bidders are advised to consult the attached Prevailing Wage schedule for Labor Law Section 220 trades.

DOHMH has eliminated Apprentices from this contract. The Apprenticeship wage schedule that was originally attached to this solicitation is hereby deemed deleted.

J. Below are answers to questions that were asked by potential bidders that were not addressed in Addendum 2:

1. QUESTION: Is this a union job? Prevailing Wage? PLA?

ANSWER: Applicable Prevailing wages apply to the labor covered under this contract.

2. QUESTION: What is the minimum amount of \$ for a job order? What is the value of job per order?

ANSWER: There is no minimum dollar value for a job order, nor is there a “value of job per order.”

3. QUESTION: What is the yearly price escalation?

ANSWER: Annual price escalations are not permitted.

4. QUESTION: Do we need to provide pricing for apprentice rates if we do not have a [an] apprentice program?

ANSWER: Please see the revised, attached bid sheet; the apprentice job title has been removed. See also the answer to question number 5 directly below.

5. QUESTION: What should we enter for those rates; if we don't have an apprentice program is the rate splicer an “M” rate?

ANSWER: Please see the revised, attached bid sheet; the apprentice job title has been removed. No apprentices shall provide labor under any contract that may result from this IFB.

6. QUESTION: Will you be asking us to supply you with Prevailing Wage payroll reports after each job.

ANSWER: Contractor will be required to comply with the reporting requirements specified by the New York City Comptroller with respect to payment of prevailing wages.

7. QUESTION: Why aren't there any minority goals on this contract, as set aside in local law? This should be reviewed.

ANSWER: The Agency has determined that subcontracting will not be permitted under this contract.

8. QUESTION: On your material sheet under fiber optic cables 1 inch plenum rated inner duct there is no quantity. Please advise.

ANSWER: Please see the revised, attached bid sheet, which now forms a part of this IFB. The quantity 2,000 has been entered.

§220 PREVAILING WAGE SCHEDULE**

LABOR LAW §220 PREVAILING WAGE SCHEDULE [EXCERPT]

Pursuant to Labor Law §220 (3) the Comptroller of the City of New York has promulgated this schedule solely for Workers, Laborers and Mechanics engaged by private contractors on New York City public work contracts. Contracting agencies anticipating doing work which requires the employment of a trade or classification not included in this schedule must request the Comptroller to establish a proper classification for the work pursuant to Labor Law §220 (3-a) (a). The prevailing rate schedule as promulgated by the Comptroller, must, in compliance with law, be annexed to and form part of the contract.

The appropriate schedule of prevailing wages and benefits must be posted at all public work sites pursuant to Labor Law §220 (3-a) (a).

This schedule is applicable for work performed during the effective period, unless otherwise noted. You will be notified of any changes to this schedule by addenda published on our web site at www.comptroller.nyc.gov. The rate of wages and supplemental benefits to be paid or provided are those that prevail at the time the work is being performed. Preliminary schedules for future one-year periods are published annually in the City Record on or about June 1st of each succeeding year. Final schedules are published on or about July 1st in the City Record and on our web site at www.comptroller.nyc.gov.

The Comptroller's Office has attempted to include all overtime, shift and night differential, Holiday, Saturday, Sunday or other premium time work. However, this schedule does not set forth every prevailing practice with respect to such rates with which employers must comply. All such practices are nevertheless part of the employer's prevailing wage obligation and contained in the collective bargaining agreements of the prevailing wage unions. These collective bargaining agreements are available for inspection by appointment. Requests for appointments may be made by calling (212) 669-4443, Monday through Friday between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Answers to questions concerning prevailing trade practices may be obtained from the Classification Unit by calling (212) 669-7974. Please direct all other compliance issues to: Bureau of Labor Law, Attn: Wasyl Kinach, P.E., Office of the Comptroller, 1 Centre Street, Room 1122, New York, N.Y. 10007; Fax (212) 669-4002.

Prevailing rates and ratios for apprentices are attached to this schedule in the Appendix. Pursuant to Labor Law §220 (3-e), only apprentices who are individually registered in a bona fide program to which the employer contractor is a participant, registered with the New York State Department of Labor, may be employed on a public work project. Workers who are not journey persons or not registered apprentices pursuant to Labor Law §220 (3-e) may not be substituted for apprentices and must be paid as journey persons.

Workers, Laborers and Mechanics employed on a public work project must receive not less than the prevailing rate of wage and benefits for the classification of work performed by each upon such public work. Contractors are solely responsible for maintaining original payroll records which delineate, among other things, the hours each employee worked within a given classification. Contractors using rates and/or classifications not promulgated by the Comptroller do so at their own risk. Additionally, prior to bid, Agency Chief Contracting Officers must contact the Bureau of Labor Law when the need arises for a work classification not published in this schedule.

Prevailing Rate Schedule Information: The information below is intended to assist you in meeting your prevailing wage rate obligation.

§220 PREVAILING WAGE SCHEDULE [EXCERPT]

Covered Workers: Any and all individuals who are engaged, employed or otherwise occupied as Workers, Laborers or Mechanics on the public work site.

Supplemental Benefits: Employers may meet supplemental benefits obligation by paying the hourly supplemental benefits rate to their employees in cash. Such cash payments are considered income to the employee. Employers who elect to provide bona fide supplemental benefits to their employees will be given hourly cash credit for such benefits up to the hourly benefits rate set forth in the applicable schedule for the relevant trade or occupation at issue.

Particular attention should be given to the supplemental benefits requirement. Although in most instances the payment or provision for supplemental benefits is for each hour worked, some classifications require the payment or provision of supplemental benefits for each hour paid. Consequently, some prevailing practices require benefits to be purchased at the overtime, shift differential, Holiday, Saturday, Sunday or other premium time rate.

Contractors are advised to review the applicable Collective Bargaining Agreements and the Comptroller's Prevailing Wage Schedule before bidding on Public Work. If there are any questions concerning prevailing wages, benefits, overtime, Holiday pay, shift differentials or any prevailing practice, please contact this office.

Public Work construction, reconstruction, demolition, excavation, rehabilitation, repair, renovation, alteration, or improvement contracts awarded pursuant to a Project Labor Agreement ("PLA") in accordance with Labor Law section 222 may have different labor standards for shift, premium and overtime work. Please refer to the PLA's pre-negotiated labor agreements for wage and benefit rates applicable to work performed outside of the regular workday. More information is available at the Mayor's Office of Contract Services (MOCS) web page at <http://www.nyc.gov/html/mocs/html/vendors/pla.shtml>.

All the provisions of Labor Law section 220 remain applicable to PLA work including, but not limited to, the enforcement of prevailing wage requirements by the Comptroller; however, we will enforce shift, premium, overtime and other non-standard rates as they appear in a project's pre-negotiated labor agreement.

Any error as to compensation under the prevailing wage law or other information as to trade classification, made by the contracting agency in the contract documents or in any other communication, will not preclude a finding against the contractor of prevailing wage violation.

Benefits are paid for EACH HOUR WORKED unless otherwise noted.
