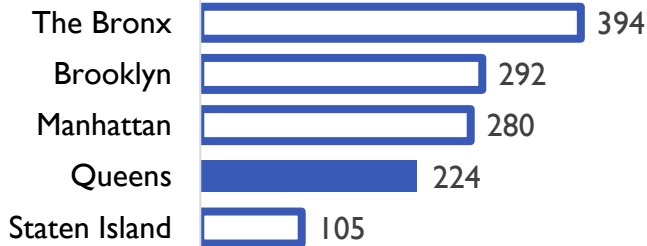


# Overdose Deaths Among Queens Residents, 2019

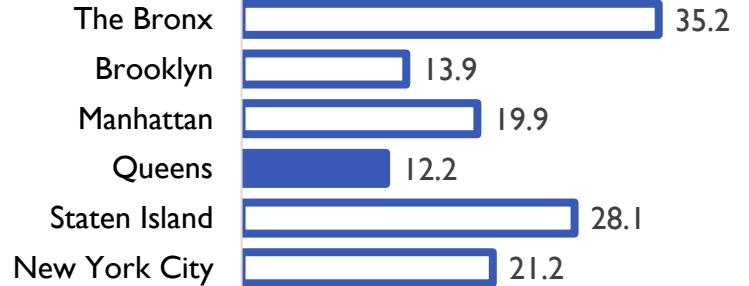
**224** Queens residents died of a drug overdose

**12.2** per 100,000 residents died of a drug overdose

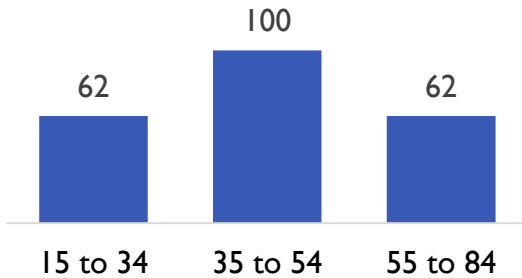
Queens residents had the second smallest number of overdose deaths.



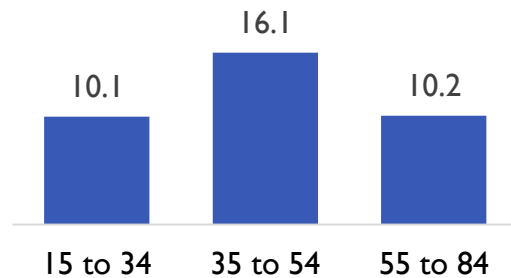
Queens residents had the lowest rate of overdose death (per 100,000 residents).



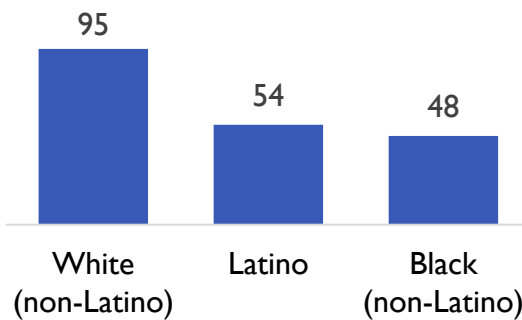
Queens residents ages 35 to 54 had the largest number of overdose deaths.



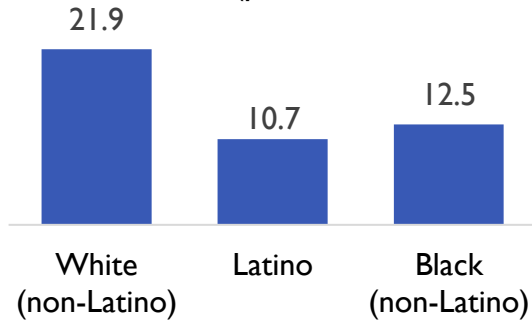
Queens residents ages 35 to 54 had the highest rate of overdose death (per 100,000 residents).



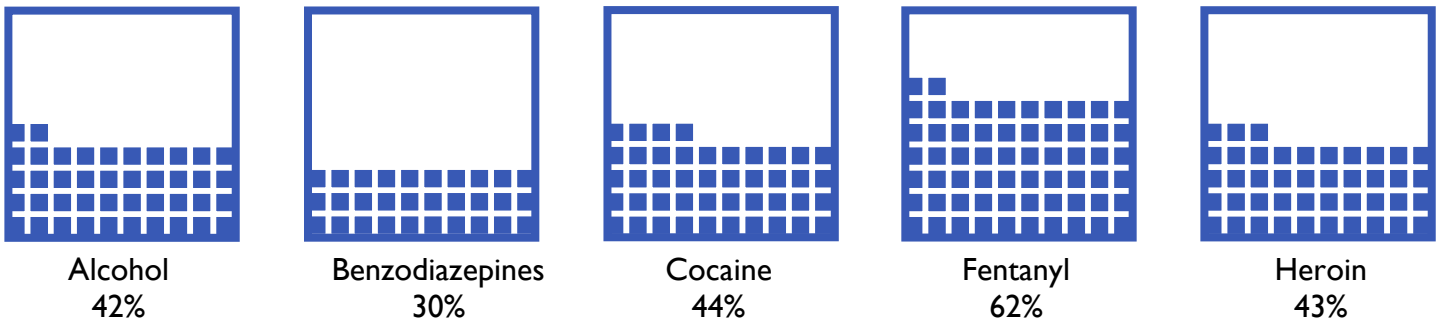
White Queens residents had the largest number of overdose deaths.
