

Get Your COVID-19 Vaccine



Now eligible: health care workers; people age 65 and older; residents and staff in nursing homes, homeless shelters and other group living facilities; and certain frontline essential workers, such as first responders, teachers and school staff, transit workers, and grocery store workers. Make an Appointment

Visit nyc.gov/vaccinefinder to find out where you can get vaccinated. Appointments are available at many sites in NYC. All appointments must be made in advance. You can also call 877-VAX-4NYC (877-829-4692) to make an appointment at an NYC site.

Preparing for Your Appointment

You will need to complete the New York State (NYS) COVID-19 Vaccine Form found at vaccineform.health.ny.gov in order to get vaccinated.

If you are eligible to get vaccinated based on employment, you must bring proof of employment in New York, such as an Employee ID, letter from your employer or affiliated organization, or recent pay stub.

If you are eligible to get vaccinated based on your age, you must bring proof of age (such as a passport or birth certificate) and proof of New York residency (such as a utility bill, other mail, or rent or mortgage statement). An NYS driver's license or IDNYC can be used as both proof of age and New York residency. Check with your vaccination site for specific requirements.

Keep the following tips in mind:

- Reschedule your appointment if you are not feeling well on the day of your appointment.
- Wear a face covering to your appointment. You will not be allowed into the site without one.
