

Who Can Receive a COVID-19 Vaccine?



Almost everyone age 12 and older can get a COVID-19 vaccine. You can get vaccinated if you have:

- ✓ Diabetes
- ✓ Asthma
- ✓ Cancer
- ✓ Heart disease
- ✓ HIV
- ✓ Kidney disease
- ✓ Liver disease
- ✓ Food allergies
- ✓ Seasonal allergies, such as a pollen allergy
- ✓ Allergies to medicine taken by mouth
- ✓ A history of blood clots
- ✓ Already had a COVID-19 infection
- ✓ Other health conditions
- ✓ Or are pregnant, breastfeeding or planning to become pregnant

The only reason you may not be able to get a COVID-19 vaccine is if you have a severe allergy to an ingredient in the vaccine or had a severe allergy to another vaccine or injectable medicine. Even if you have or had an allergy, you still may be able to get vaccinated, but you should talk to your health care provider **before** doing so. COVID-19 vaccines **do not** contain preservatives, latex, eggs, mercury, fetal tissue or human cells, gelatin or other animal products, antibiotics, or microchips.
