

Payment Options for Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP)

Health Insurance and Government Programs

Private insurance	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Most private insurances cover PrEP. • Coverage varies based on plan. There may be deductibles and co-payments.
Medicaid	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PrEP prescription costs, medical appointments and lab tests are covered. • Prior approval is required; approval must be renewed every three months. • Visit http://www.health.ny.gov/diseases/aids/general/prep/truvada.htm
PrEP Assistance Program (PrEP-AP)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Program serves HIV-negative, uninsured or underinsured New York State residents. • Patients must have income less than 435% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) (in 2016, \$51,200 for a one-person household). • Program covers costs of doctor's visits and lab testing. Services include HIV, STI/STD testing, counseling and supportive primary care services consistent with clinical guidelines for PrEP. • PrEP medication may be available for uninsured or underinsured individuals through the Gilead patient assistance programs (PAPs) listed below. • Providers enrolled in the New York State Medicaid Program can enroll in PrEP-AP. Gilead Advancing Access program and co-pay coupon card	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Advancing Access provides assistance to appropriate patients who are uninsured or underinsured, or who need financial assistance to pay for PrEP. Program offerings include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Access to counselors who can help patients and their providers with insurance-related questions, including coverage options. • The Advancing Access Co-pay Coupon Program, which provides co-pay assistance for eligible patients (up to \$3,600 in co-pays per year with no monthly limit). • The Advancing Access PAP, which provides Gilead medications at no charge for eligible patients with no other insurance options. Patient must have annual income less than 500% of the FPL (in 2016, \$59,400 for a one-person household). • Contact: 1-800-226-2056 or visit www.gileadadvancingaccess.com
Patient Access Network Foundation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Offers services to people with chronic disease for whom cost limits access to critical medical treatment due to rising deductibles and co-pays. • Offers one-time grant to cover up to \$7,500 of prescription costs for one year. • Patient must have private insurance, Medicare or Medicaid. • Patient must have annual income less than 500% FPL (in 2016, \$59,400 for a one-person household).
