

Justice Plus emphasizes work readiness opportunities that link to trades/vocations and soft skills taught in a workplace context included but not limited to during community benefit projects and internships. Participants must be referred by designated Cure Violence service provider, have been clients of the Cure Violence program or otherwise identified to be in need of such services by the Cure Violence provider. Participants may also receive a stipend up to \$1,500.
