





ESCR CURRENT STAFF

Total PMCM Staff: 200

Project Area 1 (PA1) New Hires: 48 Staff from MWBE Subs: 40.5% (81 of 200)

ALL WORK IS SUBJECT TO CHANGE

- 1. Esplanade removal and **reconstruction** activities along the waterfront.
 - Deep sewer activities/pile install and park drainage work.
 - Floodwall (Combi-wall) pre-drilling and installation.
 - Fill material delivery by barge and placement onsite.
 - Ballfields 1 and 2 construction
- 2. Delancey Street pile install and pier construction.
- 3. Construction for new Corlears Hook bridge.
- Passive lawn partial closure for esplanade work.
 February 2024 full closure for Delancey St. bridge staging.
- 5. Utility work around Montgomery Street & South Street. Begin floodwall construction in 2024.


- 6. Montgomery St. Cherry St. Greenway floodwall activities.
- 7. E. Houston Street pile install. Pedestrian Detour Shift. Construction operations at ballfields 3, 4 & 5
- 8. Slip Ramps in use.
- 9. E 10th Street utility work and deep sewer work.
- 10. Ongoing partial FDR lane closures continue at various locations.

Weekly Bulletins & Advisories are issued with construction activities. Saturday work is anticipated for some work operations as indicated.





- 4. Nature Exploration and Water Play
- 5. Delancey Street Lawn
- 6. South Basketball Courts
- 7. South BBQ area
- 8. Esplanade and pathways south of Williamsburg Bridge
- 9. Delancey Street and Corlears Hook Park Pedestrian Bridges

Plantings:

The contractor will plant during the Fall 2024 planting season

Access:


- Access via Pier 42 and the temporary bridge from Corlears Hook Park maintained
- Delancey Street Bridge upon opening
- Corlears Hook Park Bridge upon opening

Other amenities will open later:

- Compost yard under design, expected opening 2026
- Shared use path, expected opening 2026
- Amphitheater stage/canopy construction to begin 2025, opening 2026
- Fireboat House TBD, pending Section 106 (see page 23)

PARK

PA1 | What We've Heard

- South Street / Montgomery Street Intersection: ESCR contractor added pictorial signage to FDR on-ramp to deter pedestrians and cyclists. DOT is working with Pier 42 to ensure safe access when the park opens spring 2024. DOT will evaluate timing of pedestrian walk signals and feasibility of delayed green vehicular signals.
- CAG written inquiries: Responses to written inquiries from the past few months are under review and will be sent to the CAG shortly.
- Passive lawn closure and esplanade: When the passive lawn closes for assembly of the Delancey Street and Corlears Hook pedestrian bridges, the adjacent esplanade is expected to remain open.

PA1 | What We've Heard – Fireboat House

- December 2023: Section 106 consultation with State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) and NYC Landmarks Preservation Commission (LPC) to review building conditions and proposed demolition.
- 2. January 2024: OMB will notify Section 106 consulting parties (Municipal Art Society, New York Landmarks Conservancy, and Lower East Preservation Initiative) of structural concerns recently discovered. NYC Department of Buildings (DOB) is performing an evaluation of the building.

3. Analysis of Alternatives:

- a) Per SHPO, OMB, DDC and NYC Parks to prepare analysis of alternatives.
- b) City to formally present findings to the consulting parties in several weeks.
- c) OMB to provide project update to the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation
- d) Provide alternatives analysis to the SHPO, LPC, and consulting parties for 30-day comment period

4. Draft of an Amendment to the Section 106 Programmatic Agreement:

- a) Identify mitigation for the adverse effect (if demo is preferred action, likely HABS recordation)
- b) OMB to prepare draft of an Amendment to the Section 106 Programmatic Agreement. The Amendment will stipulate the mitigation to be conducted
- c) Provide Amendment to the Programmatic Agreement to SHPO, LPC, NYC Parks, and consulting parties for 30-day comment period
- d) Execute Amendment to the Programmatic Agreement




Mobilization Late-January 2024

Interceptor gate chamber construction is a critical piece of the flood protection system which connects to the interceptor sewer

- Partial closure of Corlears Hook Park ballfield.
 - Youth-sized league field will remain.
 - Parks coordinating alternative locations for adult leagues.
 - New synthetic turf will be installed in the open portion of the athletic field this Winter 2024 (Parks)
- Partial closure of Corlears Hook Park playground.
- Access to temporary bridge will remain.

Summer 2025

- Contractor will restore remaining ballfield and return to NYC Parks when work concludes.
- Playground area will be restored.



Upcoming closures to facilitate interceptor gate chamber construction.

PC | What We've Heard

- Avenue C final design tree plantings: During final restoration, four trees will be planted in the median of Avenue C between E. 20th Street and E. 23rd Street.
- Movement of large equipment in/out of site: The contractor will use the shared use path adjacent to the FDR to bring equipment in and out of the staging area. The large equipment, such as the excavators and crane, will be removed from the park after the interceptor gate chamber is installed and prior to construction of the interceptor gate building.
