

Who can apply: SCHE recipients who continue to meet the program's eligibility requirements. You may qualify for SCHE if the total combined annual income of the property's owners and their spouses is \$58,399 or less and every owner is 65 or older. (If the owners are spouses or siblings, only one must be 65+.) With some exceptions, the property must be the primary residence of all owners.
