


Many resources are available to all New Yorkers. Your immigration status and your income do not matter.


NYC Health + Hospitals provides care to ALL New Yorkers. Your immigration status and your insurance status do not matter. **If you need help, get help.** Help includes emergency care, doctor's visits, medications, long-term care, and hospital stays.

Scammers have come up with many ways to lie or steal from people in connection with COVID-19. These scams may be phone calls, emails, text messages, or sometimes even in person!

All New Yorkers should get a **free COVID-19 test**. Your immigration status does not matter.

To find a testing site near you, visit nyc.gov/covidtest or call **311** and say “**COVID-19 test.**”



Health insurance plans, including free plans, are available to many New Yorkers.

You can sign up online at nyc.gov/healthinsurance or **call 311** and say “**health insurance**” to schedule an appointment to enroll in a plan.



All New Yorkers can receive **free meals** during the COVID-19 crisis. Your immigration status does not matter.

Free legal advice and help with applying for **housing assistance** are available to all New York City residential renters. Your immigration status and your income do not matter.

If you need help with legal issues related to housing, eviction or issues with your landlord, visit **nyc.gov/tenantprotection** or call **311** and say “**tenant helpline.**”

Visit **nyc.gov/housingconnect** to find and apply for affordable housing.

You have **rights as a worker**. Your immigration status does not matter. You have a right to paid sick leave under the New York City law.

Immigrant New Yorkers with work authorization may qualify for unemployment insurance benefits.

Financial assistance is available for small businesses to address the economic impact of COVID-19.

No one has a right to treat you badly on the basis of your race, your gender, or other part of your identity.

NYPD officers are not allowed to ask about your immigration status.
