

01 - FEATURE WALL.

The feature wall has been removed to expose the east elevation and door of the vault. The vault's massing, details and finishes remain legible and the revised configuration preserves the vault as the dominant feature within the space.

02 - VIEWING ROOM ENCLOSURE

This is a critical program space for the gallery within the banking hall. The area within the vault is not usable for programmatic or operational functions and this enclosure interprets and relocates that vault area while utilizing the widest section of the mezzanine.


To address the commissioners' concerns about the design, detail and impact on the vault and its relationship to the overall space, the feature wall has been eliminated and the enclosure reconfigured in a symmetrical composition, an interpretation of the solidity and regularity of the vault below. The partitions are set back to the recessed plane of the marble, allowing the cornice to project from the facades. Recreated cresting, which originally existed at the vault's top, provides a stronger termination to the vault. A reveal at the base of the enclosure will provide a physical and visual break above the cornice.

03 - PARTITIONS

The partitions under the mezzanine have been reconfigured and no longer engage at the columns. The partitioned spaces are tucked behind the column line in deference to the columns while still providing a minimal footprint required for gallery operations

04 - MEZZANINE NICHE

The partition within the window niche has been removed. The window will receive translucent film similar to the other windows.

05 - FINISHES

Samples of the finishes were made to convey the tonality and relationship to historic materials within the space that did not read true in the renderings.

The proposed floor stain is resonant with the principal decorative motif formed by gray stone within the central stone runner, which is separated from the wood floor by broad bands of gray concrete. Similarly, the proposed white wall finishes have been sampled to accurately display the relationship within the space. The proposed white is consistent with other white painted features within the space. The finishes on new walls are temporary and can be changed as part of the exhibition program.


06 - CEILING

The lighting design has been revised to create a continuous system along the existing grid of the historic ceiling, which is articulated in flat plaster. This system is a minimal approach that reinforces the architectural expression of the ceiling and is finished to match the ceiling. The pendant lights, which uplight each coffer, have been raised so as to not break the plane of the grid and will have a dark finish consistent with the rosettes that originally occupied the coffers.


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Existing Plaster Ceiling Framework




L1- SURFACE MOUNTED TRACKLIGHT


