"transaction" is the clause, "subject to  
the franchisee filing all required  
documents with the New York City Department  
of Finance and satisfactory resolutions of  
any outstanding issues."

MR. FRIEDMAN: Yes. Good  
afternoon. Comptroller Stringer is pleased  
to be able to support the approval of

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Resolutions No. 1 to 5, which together authorize the change of control of the cable television franchises held by Time Warner Cable New York City to New Charter, Inc. Our approval is based on Charter's promise to comply with all of the provisions of the existing franchises, including critical clauses concerning investment in broadband, local employment, and public access television.

In addition, the Comptroller is encouraged by Charter's strong commitment to diversity and inclusion, both on the board level, and in its recruitment and retention, procurement, programmatic and philanthropy practices, as evidenced in the memorandum of understanding that they entered into with a series of Multicultural Leadership Organizations.

Comptroller Stringer has also long recognized the extremely important role played by public access broadcasting, which continues to provide diverse neighborhood-level programming that New

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Yorkers cannot find anywhere else. These networks serve populations that otherwise have no meaningful opportunities in the field of media-making, education and distribution. We are pleased that Charter has committed to ensuring that New York City will remain the leading media market in the United States on public access broadcasting by continuing to provide Public, Educational and Government Access Channels fees to the public access providers at least at current levels, regardless of changes in technology.

Moreover, we are pleased that Charter has committed to on-shoring Time Warner's call centers to the U.S. We are encouraged by Charter's commitment to explore the possibility of expanding call centers within the five boroughs, further improving service and enhancing job opportunities for New Yorkers.

Lastly, while the Comptroller applauds Charter's efforts to close the digital divide through a new high-speed

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Internet offering for low-income New Yorkers, he is concerned that one of the proposed restrictions on eligibility will unfairly hurt many families. Specifically, Charter plans to offer its plan to families with children who receive free or reduced-price meals through the National School Lunch Program and senior citizens on Supplemental Security Income. However, families that currently have Time Warner Cable Internet access will be ineligible for the new offering, even if they otherwise qualify based on income, unless they go without Internet access for 60 days. This will create a situation in which families that have struggled to make Internet access a reality in their homes will be unfairly penalized for the effort by being shut out of a program that is specifically designed for their benefit.

The policy is particularly concerning given that income-eligible households enrolled in Time Warner Cable television and/or telephone service will be

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eligible for the new Internet offering. I therefore urge Charter to eliminate this hurdle and provide low-cost, high-speed Internet on an equal basis to all income-eligible households.

For all the reasons previously mentioned, I support Resolutions No. 1 through 5, and look forward to working with Charter to increase cable access in the city, while also working with them to continue to strive for improvements in local hiring, diversity and options for low-income New Yorkers.

I just wanted to echo on behalf of the Manhattan Borough President's Office that while we're supportive of this and Item No. 3, the Manhattan Borough President has long worked for Internet access at -- more inclusive Internet access, and it was heartening to hear people talk about the MOU and both the diversity efforts but also the inclusion efforts and the low cost efforts and I just

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want people to know that we had discussions with representatives of New Charter and one of the concerns we had, as we read the previous agreement, the low-cost option was not available to people who had credit problems in the past, which of course to have a low-cost option for low-income people that involves a credit check or credit hurdles can be completely counterproductive to the goal of that program. And the representatives of New Charter have assured us that there will not be a credit check involved and that any delinquent payments will just have to be brought up-to-date and those low-income seniors or low-income families would be able to access the low-cost option, so that made us very happy.

Also, I just want to emphasize that I know my understanding is that most of the slated dollars for infrastructure upgrades are to catch sort of upstate up to where the city is. But we want to emphasize the importance of upgrades in the

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city and in Manhattan as well.

But with that, we are supportive.

Sharing and echoing the sentiments of the Comptroller's Office and the Manhattan Borough President's Office, Borough President Adams remains committed to seeing a number of issues addressed and as we receive assurances from Charter on some of these issues, including support for community access organizations, which in Brooklyn is BRIC, which plays a very important role in the cultural dynamic of the borough. And we're pleased to see that Charter remains committed to supporting BRIC, not just through its contractual obligations but also additionally above and beyond that.

Access to broadband for low-income families, as was very well said by the Manhattan Borough President's Office, as well as diversity, both at the (inaudible) level and also diversity of opportunity for residents of the borough and infrastructure

3 Brooklyn. While we're very (inaudible) to  
4 hear the Public Service Commission require  
5 300 megabits as the floor, by which Charter  
6 needs to bring up the speed across the  
7 entire state, we just want to point out  
8 that last year this committee was engaged  
9 in a very long discussion on green gigabit  
10 speed across New York City. And we hope  
11 that even though it's a slightly different  
12 technology and there's different  
13 infrastructural challenges related to  
14 Charter's work at gigabit speed, we'd like  
15 to see 300 be the floor, not the ceiling,  
16 in terms of the potential for  
17 infrastructure investments in broadband  
18 across the entire city.
