Procurement Title: Targeted Approach to Jail-Based Programs and Services

Agency: Department of Corrections

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### Procurement Description:

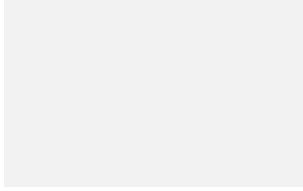
The New York City Department of Correction is seeking 4-6 qualified vendors for its jail-based program model. This jail-based program model will require award recipients to support the implementation and management of risk, need and interest assessments, the targeted delivery of programs and the delivery of enrichment activities. Through collaboration with the Mayor's Office of Criminal Justice, the City seeks to create a continuum of pre- and post-release services beginning at New Admission and extending after release to the community. For this proposal request, the Department welcomes one proposal per vendor. The inclusion of subcontractor assistance is strongly encouraged.

For this proposal, the recipient is expected to provide jail-based program programming, activities and transitional services in identified areas (e.g., general and special population housing units and congregate areas) throughout the week (including weekends). Program hours shall encompass daytime and evening hours. Group sessions shall be formatted in 90-minute blocks with additional time made available to engage with participants before and after group work to assist in the development of Service Plans or meet with community-based staff. Program content shall reflect the Risk-Need-Responsivity principle as well as individual interests, and shall include, but not be limited to, contemporary counseling strategies, discharge planning, educational services, cognitive-behavioral therapy, emotional regulation and coping skills, financial literacy, wellness, cultural awareness, gender identity and/or responsivity, discharge planning, vocational training, workforce readiness, hard skill development, vocational and certificate programs, substance abuse education, harm reduction awareness, enrichment activities, trauma informed care, and relationship and parenting support.
