

**New York City COVID Resource Center:**  
Funding Opportunity Checklist for Social Service Organizations

Multiple funding sources are available to social service and community-based organizations responding to COVID-19. This checklist, while not all encompassing, is designed to support these organizations in navigating and managing current and future funding opportunities.

### Applying for Direct Federal Funding Relief

- Monitor updates on [FEMA Disaster Relief Funding](#)** for information on available funding and eligibility criteria
- Monitor for fund availability through:**
  - The [Paycheck Protection Program](#), for loans that are forgivable when used for payroll costs; loans can be for up to two months of average monthly payroll costs plus 25% and are generally available to businesses that meet the U.S. Small Business Administration's small business [size standards](#) or have 500 employees or less
  - The [Economic Injury Disaster Loan Emergency Advance \(EIDL\) Program](#), for up to \$10,000 in economic relief for businesses experiencing temporary difficulties; these loans are generally available to businesses with 500 employees or less
- Determine eligibility for the [Express Bridge Loan Program](#)**, which allows small businesses with existing relationships with an SBA Express Lender to access up to \$25,000 quickly
- Consider applying for low-interest loans** through the [Industry Stabilization Fund](#) (available to non-profits with 500 – 10,000 employees who maintain 90% of their staff at full compensation)
- Assess applicability of the [SBA Debt Relief](#) program**, which will pay the principal, interest, and fees on certain SBA loans
- Retain employees to earn the [Employee Retention Payroll Tax Credit](#)**<sup>1</sup> of up to \$5,000 per employee on payroll after certain conditions are met
- Apply for a grant** from the [National Endowment for the Humanities \(NEH\) CARES: Cultural Organizations](#), a program granting up to \$300,000 per applicant to support humanities organizations affected by the Coronavirus
- Apply for funds or sub-grants** from the [National Endowment for the Arts \(NEA\)](#) in the amount of \$50,000 (direct funding) or \$100,000 or \$250,000 (subgranting) for cultural institutions affected by the Coronavirus
- Review the [Administration for Children and Families](#)** webpage for information on how to apply for CARES Act funding for Head Start, Runaway and Homeless Youth Programs, and Family Violence Prevention and Services
- Track updates on the [Department of Agriculture Food Box Distribution Program](#)** for details on how food banks, community and faith organizations and other non-profits can register for donations of fresh produce, dairy and meat, and for more details on \$850 million in [funding to support food bank administrative costs](#)
- Monitor funding made available through the [Provider Relief Fund](#)**; if your organization bills Medicare or Medicaid you may be eligible in future funding releases

<sup>1</sup> Note that employers who receive an emergency SBA 7(a) loan are not eligible for these credits.
