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

#### **Roundtable Member Outreach Strategies**

- As a Resident Roundtable member, you are responsible for gathering and sharing information with NYCHA residents within your Neighborhood Portfolio.
- Outreach methods may include (but are not exclusive to):
  - ✓ Telephone Calls/ Text Messages
  - ✓ Emails
  - ✓ Social Media
  - ✓ Word of Mouth
  - ✓ Flyer/Newsletter Distribution
  - ✓ Door to Door
  - Tabling/Talking to residents in common areas
  - Attending Community Meetings

**Roundtable Member Outreach Strategies:** 

- Identifying Key Resources
- NYCHA can assist by:
  - Introducing Resident Roundtable Members via NYCHA communications
  - Facilitating introduction to Resident Leaders & CBOs
  - Sharing publicly available development demographics and maps
- NYCHA cannot share Personally Identifiable Information (PII) without the express written consent of residents.



#### **Roundtable Member Outreach Strategies:** Getting Started

- Identifying Key Neighborhood Stakeholders
  - Resident Association Leaders\*
  - Key Influencers of the Neighborhood (unofficial leaders)
  - Local Community Based Organizations (Community & Senior Centers, Settlement Houses, etc.)
- Identifying Key Opportunities to Share Information and Gather Feedback
  - Community events/meetings/communications (preexisting & Roundtable Member-established)



#### Roundtable Member Outreach Strategies: Role of Resident Council per § PART 964—TENANT PARTICIPATION AND TENANT OPPORTUNITIES IN PUBLIC HOUSING:

The role of a resident council is to improve the quality of life and resident satisfaction and participate in self-help initiatives to enable residents to create a positive living environment for families living in public housing. Resident councils may actively participate through a working partnership with the HA to advise and assist in all aspects of public housing operations.

- Resident councils consist of persons residing in public housing and represent public housing residents in a particular development, building or combination of buildings
- The resident council shall hold frequent meetings with the residents to ensure that residents have input and are aware and actively involved in HA management-resident council decisions and activities.
- Resident councils must adopt written procedures/by laws which provides for the election of residents to the governing board by the voting membership at least every three (3) years. At a minimum, the governing board should consist of five (5) elected board members.
- The voting membership must consist of heads of households (any age) and other residents at least 18 years of age or older and whose name appears on a lease for the unit in the public housing that the resident council represents.
- Officially recognized Resident Councils are eligible to receive funds for resident council activities, and stipends for officers for their related costs for volunteer work in public housing
