DOMESTIC VIOLENCE CALLS FOR ASSISTANCE*

Police responded to 257,813 domestic violence incidents in 2011; this averages to over 700 incidents per day. In addition, NYPD's Domestic Violence Unit conducted 73,016 home visits in 2010, a 91% increase since 2002.

In 2011, the City's Domestic Violence Hotline advocates answered 114,760 calls, averaging more than 310 calls per day. * Statistics provided by NYPD and Safe Horizon

DATING VIOLENCE PREVENTION

Since its inception in 2005 through December 31, 2011, the New York City Healthy Relationship Training Academy of the Mayor's Office to Combat Domestic Violence has reached 24,819 young people through 1,249 peer education workshops. PROJECT H.E.A.L. (Hospital Emergency Assistance Link)

City public hospitals have digital cameras that document injuries and Domestic Violence Coordinators who assist victims and connect them with social and legal services.

NEW YORK CITY FAMILY JUSTICE CENTER, BROOKLYN

Since opening in July 2005 through December 31, 2011, this center has served 46,060 new clients seeking domestic violence services and 8,286 children were supervised in the Center's Children's Room, Margaret's Place. There have been 98,012 adult client visits to the Center since it opened.

NEW YORK CITY FAMILY JUSTICE CENTER, QUEENS

Since opening in July 2008 through December 31, 2011, this center has served 13,310 new clients seeking domestic violence services and 2,807 children were supervised in the Center's Children's Room, Margaret's Place. There have been 34,587 client visits to the Center since it opened.

NEW YORK CITY FAMILY JUSTICE CENTER, BRONX

Since opening in April 2010 through December 31, 2011, this center has served 8,644 new clients seeking domestic violence services and 1,962 children were supervised in the Center's Children's Room. There have been 21,104 client visits to the Center since it opened.
