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1. Policy

The FAU shall follow the specified procedures and requirements for addressing nonconformities and implementing corrective actions, when appropriate. This quality man at cument fulfills the requirements of the ISO/IEC 17020 International Standards.

2. Sche

The obcedure and requirements outlined apply to all FAU personnel who are involved in a ressile noncont mities.

3. Addressing No samities

- Nonconformit A reconformit is a violation or non-compliance of a requirement outlined in the NAU OPs. A nonconformity can be identified at any time and by anyone. The individual(s) was identified a normal normal must inform the Quality Assurance (QA) Specialist or a OCME Quality Assurance Director (QA Director) in a timely manner.
- 3.2 **Nonconformity Levels:** The QA Special or the QA Director is responsible for reviewing the nonconformity and assigning it to the of the two nonconformity types based on severity of the issue. The response take shall vary depending on the nonconformity level assigned.
 - 3.2.1 **Type 1:** Type 1 nonconformity refers to non-constance that can potentially undermine analytical conclusions, security materials evidence and case records, negatively impact accreditation, and/or pose a secety hazard. Examples of Type 1 nonconformities include, but are not limited.
 - Faulty equipment.
 - Failure to secure anthropology labs.
 - Failure to wear appropriate personal prescrive equation (i. E).
 - Failure to conduct audit on time.

A Type 1 nonconformity should be corrected as soon as possible (e.g., faulty equipment). The nonconformity shall be appropriately documented see section 3.4 documentation). If a Type 1 nonconformity requires more than a simple correction and an underlying cause needs to be identified and addressed, then the Corrective Action process should be followed (see section 3.3).

3.2.1 **Type 2:** Type 2 nonconformity refers to major non-compliances that directly undermine analytical conclusions, the security and integrity of evidence and case

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records, accreditation, and/or pose a safety hazard. Examples of Type 2 nonconformities include, but are not limited to:

- Substandard analytical results
- Unauthorized access to evidence
- A direct compromise of the integrity of evidence.

All Type 2 nonconformities shall be subject to the corrective action process described by w.

3.3 **Correcte At on P cedures**: A corrective action aims to identify the underlying systemic causes a "major" nonconformity (Type 2) or repetitive minor nonconformitie (Type 1) and implement steps to correct and to minimize the risk of recurrence.

When a corrective action is deemed necessary, a Corrective Action Request (CAR) Form shall be used to reconsend track the affective action taken to resolve the issue. The QA Specialist is typically responsible a managing corrective actions; however any member of the FAU can be assigned to implement a prrective action request by the Forensic Anthropology Director (Director). Additionary, the OCME QA Director can step in to manage a CAR if an external approver is called.

- 3.3.1 Corrective Action Request (CAP) Form: the CAR Form records the non-compliant situation or condition ader review, the requirement source(s) (e.g., describe the specific clauses in the FAU SOPs quality Manual that were violated), the name of the individual possible a implementing the corrective action, the cause(s) of the situation or condition ader review, the action step(s), and the expected date of completion.
- 3.3.2 **Corrective Action Steps:** Depending on the nath of the nonce to tity, the appropriate action steps may include, but are not limited to:
 - Halt casework and finalization of anthropologreports that may have been affected by the nonconformity
 - Review of, and correction to, any relevant casew
 - Inform clients, when necessary
 - Issuing amendments to reports
 - Remedial training
 - Revision of policies, procedures, and/or forms
 - Inclusion of additional quality measures.
- 3.3.3 **Approving a CAR:** The designated CAR approver (i.e., QA Specialist, Director or OCME Quality Assurance Director) shall review the CAR to determine if all

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the required sections of the CAR Form have been adequately filled out and that the action steps are acceptable and appropriate. If the CAR is determined inadequate it shall be returned for revision. Once the CAR action steps have been reviewed and accepted, the designated approver shall sign and date the form in the state calculated approver shall sign and the form to the individual sponsible for implementing the CAR action steps.

Note: The designated CAR approver shall not be the individual assigned to fill out the R Form and implement the action step(s).

- 3.3.4 **Complete Corrective Actions**: Upon completion of the action step(s), the individual response implementing the CAR shall sign and date the form in the span label of "Action tep(s) Completed by" before returning the form to the designated are rover.

 - 3.3.5.1 If the approver determines the action step(s) core not sufficiently implemented or the action step(s) did not effectively address the nonconformity the CAR form shall be considered to the individual responsible for managing the CAR for fracter action.
- 3.4 **Documentation**: All Corrective Action Requests and associated records all be a tained by the FAU for at least one accreditation cycle. Additionally, koncor armities and their associated corrective actions shall be recorded and maintained one digital docur int in order to track possible trends (see Nonconformity and CAR Log). At minimum, the following information shall be recorded for each nonconformity identified.
 - Assigned nonconformity level
 - Description of nonconformity
 - Requirement source
 - Whether a corrective action was taken (if yes, then also the date of completion)
 - Name of individual responsible for managing the CAR.
