# **Virtual Meeting Resolutions**



## Origin

The 2010 Charter Revision Commission proposed a mechanism to review and potentially waive required reports and advisory bodies.

Voters approved measure by referendum.

	City Question 2. Elections and Government Administration: The proposal would amend the City Charter to:
FINAL REPORT OF THE 2010 NEW YORK CITY CHARTER REVISION COMMISSION	<ul> <li>Disclosure of Independent Campaign Spending: Require public disclosure of expenditures made by entities and individuals independent from candidates to influence the outcome of a city election or referendum;</li> <li>Ballot Access: Generally reduce the number of petition signatures needed by candidates for city elective office to appear on a ballot;</li> <li>Voter Assistance and Campaign Finance Board: Merge voter assistance functions, including a reconstituted Voter Assistance Advisory Committee, into the Campaign Finance Board, and change when Campaign Finance Board member terms begin;</li> <li>Conflicts of Interest Law: Require all public servants to receive conflicts of interest training, raise the maximum fine for a public servant who violates the City's conflicts of interest law, and allow the City to recover any benefits obtained from such violations;</li> <li>City Administrative Tribunals: Authorize the Mayor to direct the merger of administrative tribunals and adjudications into the Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings and permit the Department of Consumer Affairs to adjudicate all violations issued by that department;</li> <li>City Reporting Requirements and Advisory Bodies: Create a commission to review requirements for reports and advisory bodies and waive the requirements, subject to City Council review, where the commission finds they are not of continuing value; and</li> <li>Map for Facility Siting: Include in the City's facilities siting map those transportation and waste management facilities operated by or for governmental entities, or by private entities that provide comparable services.</li> </ul>

### **Charter mandate**

### RABRC is charter-mandated (Chapter 49, Section 1113) to:

- 1. Review all instances where the Charter, Admin Code, or a local law requires a reporting requirement or advisory board.
  - Excludes:



- 2. Meet on a regular basis to make recommendations regarding waivers of reporting requirements and advisory boards.
  - Notable waiver requirements:

Requirements can't be waived until 3 years after enacted Requirements can be waived *in part* **and** retained *in part* 



### Process



#### \*RABRC can waive a report or advisory board by a majority vote.



### History

2012: waived 7 reports and 8 boards 2021: waived 6 reports (2 reinstated) 2022/23 cycle: waived 8 reports

### **Evaluating reports/advisory boards**

RABRC evaluates waiver candidates according to multiple criteria, including:

Usefulness	Does it provide useful information in evaluating program results or other activities? Does it provide useful information for assessing effective management of City resources?
Redundancy	Does this information exist somewhere else? Is it wholly or partially duplicative of the subject matter of another mandated report?
Relevance	Considering changing circumstances, is this report still necessary?
Benefit	Is it worth the cost of production?

\*\*Considerations for reports and advisory boards are materially the same
