INTRODUCTION

The annual Statements of Community District Needs (CD Needs Statements) and the Community Board Budget Requests (Budget Requests) are Charter requirements and an integral part of the City's budget process. When developed through informed planning and careful consideration, CD Needs Statements and Budget Requests can play an important role in consultations of community boards with agencies, elected officials and other key stakeholders on a broad range of local planning and budget priorities. These tools also provide a valuable public resource for neighborhood planning and research purposes, and are used by a wide audience seeking information about New York City's diverse communities.

This year, for the first time, community boards electronically submitted a CD Needs Statement combined with their Budget Requests. The goal of these improvements is to simplify preparation of both documents for the community boards and to make the information community boards provide more easily accessible for City agencies and other stakeholders. Simplified and more efficient processes will allow all parties involved in the budget process to consider budget decisions more thoroughly, with better results for all New Yorkers.

2. OVERVIEW OF COMMUNITY DISTRICT

Brooklyn Community Board 15 provided the following overview of their district:

District Overview

Community Board 15 is a vibrant mixed-use community. The District is bordered to the North by the large commercial strip of Kings Highway, to the West by the industrial area of McDonald Avenue, to the South by the beachfront community of Manhattan Beach and to the East by the year round recreational community of Gerritsen Beach, other residential areas include Gravesend, Homecrest, Madison, Midwood and Plumb Beach. The District is still recovering from the effects of Superstorm Sandy with many areas such as Gerritsen Beach, Plumb Beach and Manhattan Beach rebuilding with current resiliency measures. It is the policy of Community Board 15 to see to the needs of the local residents it serves and ensure the delivery of services to the District. Open communication between residents and the Community Board is an essential part of maintaining public safety, development and prosperity for all.

POPULATION

According to current statistics supplied by the City Of New York the most recent studies conducted in 2013, calculate the overall population of Community Board 15 (Brooklyn) has decreased by 5% to 151,177. According to the 2012 Department of City Planning vital statistics, the birth rate increased since 2005, at 13.7 %. The death-rate dropped 8.0%, and infant mortality rate increased from 1.6% to 2.6%. Statistics from 2014 show that the largest percentage change occurred in the District Income Support with 34.4% of the population 54,860 people up from 43,339 receiving income support either by Social Security or Medicaid. The District is ethnically diverse including but not limited to: African, Chinese, Hispanic, Irish, Italian, Israeli, Japanese, Korean, Pakistani, Russian and Turkish.

LAND USE

According to the Department of City Planning (2014), the total land area of Community Board 15 is 4.7 square miles. The District includes: one and two-family residential units (50.6%), multi-family residential units (17.8%) and mixed residential-commercial units (3.6%). Non-residential land use in the District includes: commercial-and-office units (6.3%), industrial regions (0.4%), transportation/facility (2.6%), institutions (8.2%), open-space recreation (2.6%), parking facilities (0.9%) and vacant land (6.5%).

3. MAIN ISSUES

As part of this year's process, community boards were asked to select from a list the three most pressing issues facing their district. Brooklyn Community Board 15 identified the following three issues:

- *Parks*
- *Street flooding*
- *Traffic*

Brooklyn Community Board 15 provided the following explanation for their choices:

FLOODING/PONDING ISSUES: Flooding and Ponding exist in places such as Gerritsen Beach and Emmons Avenue. Both areas lack proper sewer drainage. Infrastructure upgrades are needed to alleviate the flooding and ponding problems that exist. This is a two-fold approach DEP for infrastructure upgrades and DOT for the reconstruction of the streets. TRAFFIC: Everyone of our Commercial areas Kings Highway, Sheepshead Bay Road, Avenue U and Avenue P are congested with double parking, truck deliveries and illegal parking. Most of these Avenues are also major transit hubs causing illegal TLC parking. We need better Traffic Enforcement, improved policing and DOT input on how to keep the traffic flowing through these congested areas. PARKS: We have a very low percentage of green space in the District and the space that we do have is well used, but most are in need of upgrades and the addition of Comfort Stations. Many of our Parks cater to young children and seniors and the need for working Comfort Stations is imperative.

4.1. Health Care and Human Services Needs and Requests

Main Issue

Services to reduce homelessness

The Community Board provided the following explanation for the above issue:

Community Board 15 has seen a huge rise in homelessness throughout the District. Whether under our overpasses, in our parks and school yards homeless individuals are taking up residency. We have homeless people creating makeshift shanty towns, begging on our streets and posing serious safety issues as people exit our train stations, blocking exits and aggressively panhandling.

Community District Needs and Requests

4.1.1. Community District Needs and Requests Related to Health Care Facilities and Programming

The Community Board provided the following high level comments and background on the District's needs:

Coney Island Hospital is the closest Health Care Facility in the District. Due to its proximity to the Belt Parkway and its central location it is the go to place for immediate treatment in Southern Brooklyn. Community Board 15 has advocated for years to establish a Level 1 Trauma Center at Coney Island Hospital. Due to the devastation from Super Storm Sandy, Coney Island Hospital is about to embark on the construction of a new flood resistant tower, this would be the perfect time to fund any needed projects such as a Trauma Center for the Hospital.

Helping Seniors maintain open lines of communication reinforces both competency and confidence. With families spread across the country, Seniors are able to stay in contact with family through SKYPE, Email and Social Media.

The NYCHA Houses in our district Sheepshead/Nostrand Houses need to be better maintained. Whether it's maintaining the grounds or responding to simple maintenance requests, these projects need to be streamlined and not take months to resolve, we need to get them expedited and in a timely fashion.

Main Issue

After school programs

The Community Board provided the following explanation for the above issue:

With both parents working in today's economy, many children of Elementary and Junior High School age in our community return to empty homes after school. It is imperative that we offer our young people interesting after school programming, that not only monitors our children and keeps them safe and off our streets, but provides them with the educational tools they will need to be successful in life.

Community District Needs and Requests

4.2.1. Community District Needs and Requests Related to Educational Facilities and Programs

The Community Board provided the following high level comments and background on the District's needs:

Kingsborough Community College 2001 Oriental Blvd. Brooklyn NY 11235 Marina Reconstruction- \$1 million This project will reconstruct the college's marina that was destroyed by Superstorm Sandy in 2012. The main pier and service connections, including water, electric and telecommunications, will be replaced. ADA-compliant access to the dock from the shore will be installed. The boat travel-lift will be relocated further west, where it will be better protected from future storms and will not silt up from future storms and wave action. A new wave-attenuator will be constructed at the eastern end of the marina to help reduce the force of wave action on the marina. This facility is pivotal to the college's academic mission since it provides hands-on training space to students in the Maritime Technology program and houses the vessels that are used for training and teaching on water. On Stage at Kingsborough- \$15,000 On Stage at Kingsborough, KCC's performing arts program, brings artistically and culturally diverse multi-disciplinary professional performances (dance, theater, film and family programs) from around the country and abroad. These funds would enable us to continue diversifying our audience through such as efforts as tickets subsidies to schools.

Main Issue

Fire Safety

The Community Board provided the following explanation for the above issue:

In Community Board 15, we have a large immigrant community who often do not realize the safety hazards of an illegal conversion. Within the district, many one or two family homes have been converted into six family homes, with occupants residing in the basement and attics posing serious safety hazards. Illegal conversions and illegal apartments are the leading cause of fatalities due to fires in our District. The need for working smoke detectors and carbon monoxide monitors must be made apparent and information should be provided in multiple languages.

Community District Needs and Requests

4.3.1. Community District Needs and Requests Related to Policing and Crime

The Community Board provided the following high level comments and background on the District's needs:

With the District being almost 6 square miles in size there is an immediate need for additional Police Officers to adequately patrol the District. The 61st Precinct is under staffed and at times many of our Officers are reassigned to work the beach patrol, at the 60th Precinct, or larger events throughout the City. Community Board 15 has received numerous complaints from residents on how low-priority crimes, such as car break-ins or traffic accidents are taking hours for a police response.

The City needs to offer Small Business owners more incentives and assistance in creating businesses, or offer store owners some incentives to attract and retain businesses. Outrageous rents are keeping many of our small commercial areas bleak and depressed.
