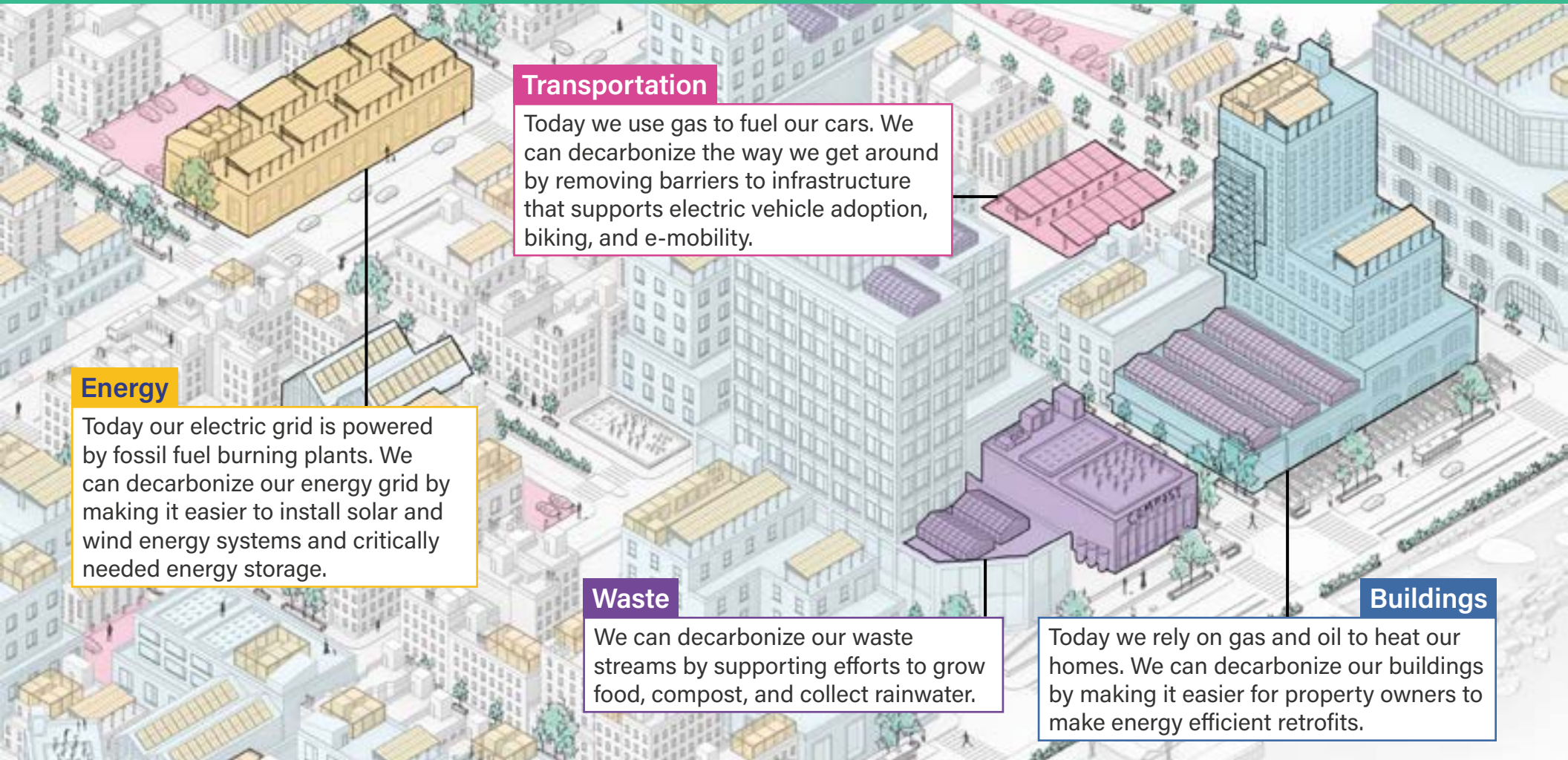

**City of Yes for Carbon Neutrality will help us decarbonize NYC.**

Decarbonize means reducing our reliance on carbon-based fuels, which are harming our health and our planet. Updating our zoning rules will make it easier to install green energy technology. City of Yes for Carbon Neutrality would modernize NYC's zoning rules to make our homes, businesses, electric power grid and even waste streams much cleaner.



## Transportation

Today we use gas to fuel our cars. We can decarbonize the way we get around by removing barriers to infrastructure that supports electric vehicle adoption, biking, and e-mobility.

## Energy

Today our electric grid is powered by fossil fuel burning plants. We can decarbonize our energy grid by making it easier to install solar and wind energy systems and critically needed energy storage.

## Waste

We can decarbonize our waste streams by supporting efforts to grow food, compost, and collect rainwater.

## Buildings

Today we rely on gas and oil to heat our homes. We can decarbonize our buildings by making it easier for property owners to make energy efficient retrofits.

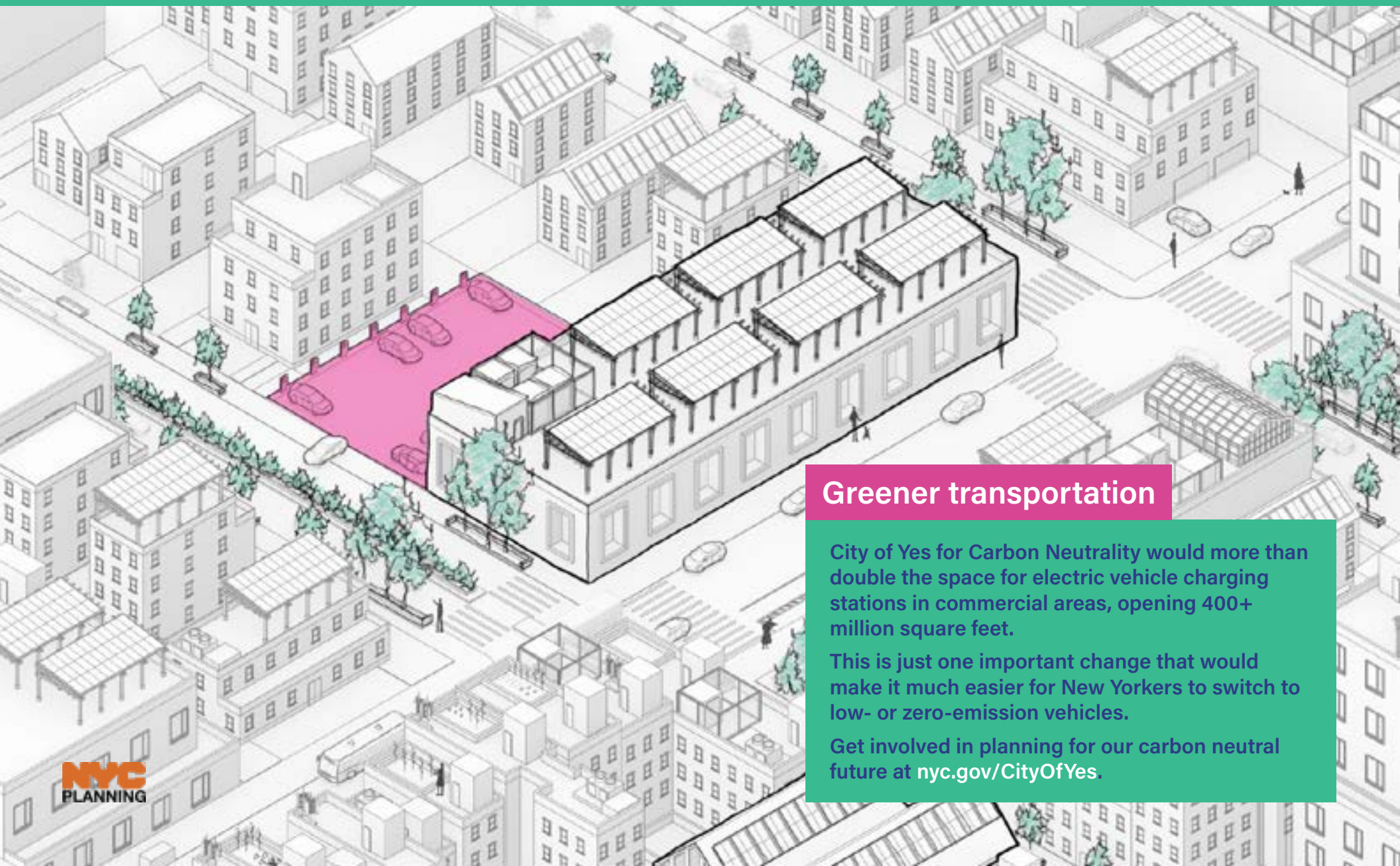

## Greener transportation

City of Yes for Carbon Neutrality would more than double the space for electric vehicle charging stations in commercial areas, opening 400+ million square feet.

This is just one important change that would make it much easier for New Yorkers to switch to low- or zero-emission vehicles.

## Less waste

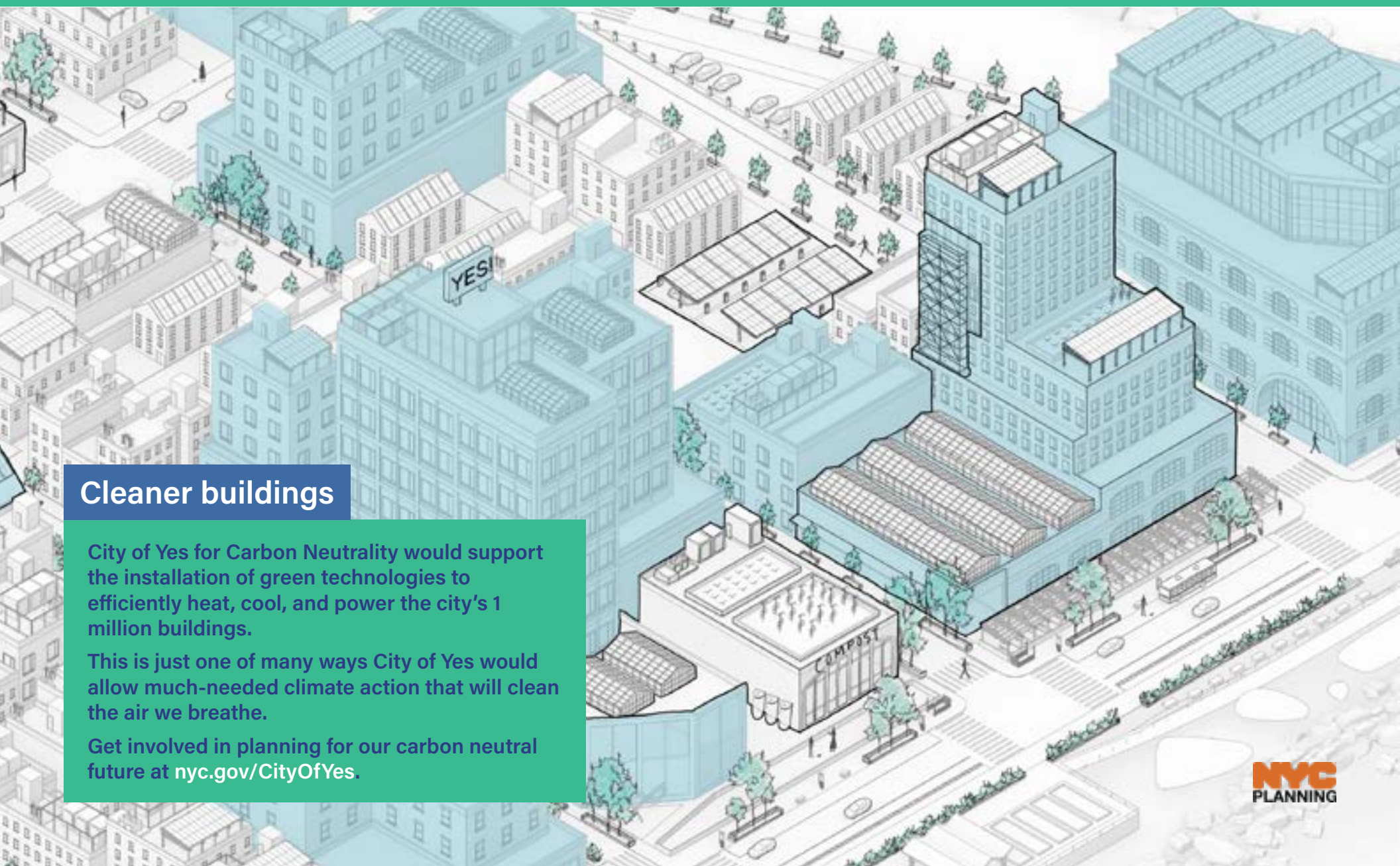
