The file structure in Access can be viewed while running the software.

(2) Information in this current release is different from the 2008.1 release as follows: The codes used for FACILITY\_TYPE field have been changed for health services, chemical dependency, mental health, developmental disabilities services, and homeless services. The changes are due to a coding change or restructuring by the source agencies. Also, a new field SERVICE\_AREA\_TYPE has been added.

(3) At the time of this release, 2010 Census Tracts were not available in Geosupport. The 2010 Census Tracts will be added to the next release of the *Selected Facilities and Program Sites in New York City* database.

Alphanumeric - 16 characters

Description:

A unique identification number assigned to each facility, program, or parkland property.

NOTE: Each parkland property is assigned a unique ID. If a property is on more than one Tax Block/Tax Lot, multiple occurrences of Tax Blocks/Tax Lots are stored for the property with the same ID.

A number of social service programs (e.g. chemical dependency and mental retardation) have identical names, addresses, and capacities. They have been assigned different IDs to indicate that they are separate programs.

NOTE: Two areas in the city, Marble Hill and Rikers Island, are each legally located in one borough but are serviced by another borough.

Specifically, Marble Hill is serviced by the Bronx but is legally located in Manhattan. A facility located in Marble Hill has a Manhattan BOROUGH code. Rikers Island is serviced by Queens but is legally located in the Bronx. A facility located on Rikers Island has a Bronx BOROUGH code.

This field consists of three digits, the first of which contains the borough code (see BORO). The second and third digits contain the community district number or the joint interest area number, whichever is applicable.

There are 59 community districts (CDs) in New York City, and 12 joint interest areas (JIAs). JIAs are parks and airports that are not contained within any single CD.

NOTE: Two areas in the city, Marble Hill and Rikers Island, are legally located in one borough and are each serviced by another borough.

Specifically, Marble Hill is legally located in Manhattan but is serviced by the Bronx. A facility located in Marble Hill has Bronx COMMUNITY DISTRICT codes of 207 or 208.

Rikers Island is legally located in the Bronx but is serviced by Queens. A facility located on Rikers Island has Queens COMMUNITY DISTRICT code of 401.

The tax block of the facility, program, or parkland property. This field is used for output display. Leading blanks precede the tax block when the data has less than 5 digits. If the facility is on more than one tax block, multiple occurrences of tax blocks are stored for the facility.

Park properties defined as "Joint NYCDOT/DPR Landscaped Area", generally named "GREENSTREET", have not been assigned a block by the Parks Department.

Certain parkland properties such as transportation-related open spaces, former street properties, waterfront, or land under water have not been assigned a block by the Parks Department. The block number for these properties are coded in the following way:

For property on a N/S street, the number of the block to the west is used.

For property on an E/W street, the number of the block to the south is used.

Format: Numeric - 4 digits (9999)  
 Description: The tax lot of the facility, program, or parkland property. This field is used for output display. Leading blanks precede the tax lot when the data has less than 4 digits. If the facility is on more than one tax lot, multiple occurrences of tax lots are stored for the facility.

Parkland properties defined as "Joint NYCDOT/DPR Landscaped Area", generally named "GREENSTREET", have not been assigned a lot by the Parks Department.

Some parkland properties are coded "999" in this field by the Parks Department. These are generally transportation-related open spaces, former street properties, waterfront, or land under water, as noted above under "BLOCK". "999" is not a valid tax lot number.

Format: Alphanumeric - 70 characters

Description: The name of the facility, program, or parkland property as identified by the source agency.

**Field Name: FACILITY\_ADDRESS**

Format: Alphanumeric - 90 characters

Description: The address of the facility, program, or parkland property. The address is usually a house number and street name but can also be a house number range and a street name; two cross streets; or a place name (e.g., Floyd Bennett Field or Roosevelt Island).

**Field Name: ZIP**

Format: Alphanumeric - 5 characters

Description: The five character Zip Code associated with the address or location of the facility or program.

**Field Name: FACILITY\_TYPE**

Format: Numeric - 4 digits (9999)

Description: A code identifying the specific type of facility, program, or parkland property.

A range of codes identifies the general classification (i.e., primary function) of the facility, program, or parkland property. Smaller ranges within the general classification range identify more specific functions within the general classifications.

**Example:** To obtain all Public Safety and Criminal Justice Facilities, select code range 2001-2999. To obtain only Criminal Justice Facilities, select code range 2501-2699 from the Public Safety and Criminal Justice classification. To obtain only Correctional Facilities, select code range 2501-2599 from the larger Criminal Justice classification. To obtain a specific type of facility (e.g., City Correctional Facility), select its corresponding four character code (2521).

This field contains a one to four character census tract number, which is preceded by leading zeros when necessary, and is followed by a two character suffix if applicable. There is no decimal point between the census tract number and its suffix. Example: 020201

If the census tract number has no suffix, the two rightmost positions will be blank. Example: 0203bb, where b is a blank.

This field contains a one to four character census tract number which is preceded by leading blanks, when necessary, (i.e., when the census tract number is less than four characters), and is followed by blanks or a decimal point and a two character suffix, when applicable. Example : b202.01, where b is a blank.
