MEDIA ADVISORY: NEW YORK CITY DEPARTMENT OF PROBATION OFFICERS DELIVER FREE GROCERIES TO THOSE IN NEED IN THE SOUTH BRONX

NEW YORK—New York City Department of Probation (DOP): Officers will deliver NeON Nutrition Kitchen Care packages containing one week of free groceries to residents at the Moor House Gardens in the South Bronx. The care packages, which include fresh produce and hand sanitizers, will help seniors and families who are unemployed, struggling to put food on the table, or unable to get to the grocery store. Partnering with the Food Bank for New York City and the NYC Young Men's Initiative, the DOP provides one week of prepackaged grocery relief to communities in need through the Neighborhood Opportunity Network (NeON) Nutrition Kitchen program available in all five boroughs. Since COVID-19 was declared a pandemic in early March, the NeON Nutrition Kitchen has tripled its capacity, serving 9,000 individuals each week to help meet community demands related to the crisis.
