DFTA My Pilot Program, is a new transportation pilot program throughout the city. This is a three-year car service with an app and dispatch options. Seniors aged 60 and older, and persons with a disability aged 18 and older will be able to access on demand rides from the car service provider to take riders within the five Boroughs, Nassau, and Westchester Counties. The goal of the program is to help seniors and individuals with disabilities to stay mobile. Eligible DFTA participants will be recruited from five Queens community districts including QN6, QN7, QN10, QN12, QN14.
