Infrastructure upgrades: the widening of South Avenue at Forest Avenue is moving along - not as fast as people would like. Sidewalks are going in on South Avenue near Netherland.

Parks construction: Grandview, now known as The Big Park, had a ribbon-cutting to mark the naming and announce the construction - which includes playground, basketball courts, a multi-use field, motion-detector water fountains and a refurbished comfort station.

\*there is concern about where children can play during summer vacation if local parks are closed for refurbishing. School playgrounds should be opened.

\*complaint that the new design does not replace the swimming pool, indicating lack of community input. RESP: Community engagement sessions were held. Open to suggestions for better ways to get the word out to the community for important meetings.

Richmond Terrace sewer project is still on hold; no projected date for re-starting.

Mayor DeBlasio's Town Hall was well attended. If you were unable to attend, or were not called on, please send your comments to CM Debi Rose, or John McBeth, who will forward to the Mayor.

We are uncomfortable with the SIEDC presenting proposals for the "Highline" only at the Hilton Garden Inn.

The 121st Pct. Summer Youth Police Academy will operate out of Pt. Richmond High School; applications are

Chris Lee discussed various closures during the demolition of the old Bayonne Bridge roadway. Innis Street to Richmond Terrace will be closed to all but any remaining residents until the fall. He once again assured the community that the contractor is self-regulating, and that work is stopped if conditions warrant. Car-wash

The Delta representative says they do not use the space, but went on to that some drivers are amputees and need to park there to use the office bathroom. . . a letter was presented, and rejected: the committee insists on zero tolerance. If possible (raise point of order with CB1) the Committee agreed to vote by e-mail on any amended Letter of Agreement.

FDNY did not attend. The proponent for the Graniteville Quarry memorial did not attend.

New Business: Many businesses have their windows 100% obscured by advertising. This is potentially dangerous, is aesthetically displeasing... what can be done?
