HEALTH & HUMAN SERVICES – Diane Peruggia

Motion: to support and advocate on behalf of the NYC retirees to preserve their earned healthcare benefits as outlined and promised in the statute in New York Administrative Code §12-126 when they were hired by the City of New York.

WHEREAS, the issue of healthcare is critical and must be protected for the 250,000 NYC retirees who worked for their healthcare rights and

WHEREAS, the proposed administration plan proposes to remove these 250,000 NYC retirees from their current healthcare plan and

WHEREAS, the proposed administration's plan would require city retirees to decide whether to opt out of the new Medicare Advantage Plan (MAP) run by Aetna, which would save the City roughly \$600 million per year and

WHEREAS, Int. 1099 of 2023 would require the City to offer Medicare-eligible city retirees and their Medicare-eligible dependents at least one Medigap plan with benefits equivalent to or better than those already available to city retirees and their dependents as of December 31, 2021; and **WHEREAS**, the administration's proposed plan would decrease city retirees' access to the same level of health care held previously by requiring pre-approvals and co-payments and will limit the current list of doctors available;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Community Board 3 supports intro 1099-2023 in City Council to ensure that the City maintains the choice of at least 1 Medigap plan, equivalent to or better

than those already available to city retirees and their dependents as of December 31, 2021, and not force retirees into a privatized Medicare Advantage plan.

PARKS & RECREATION & ENVIRONMENTAL – Albert Klingele

WHEREAS, parks and green spaces provide numerous benefits to communities, including promoting physical and mental health, providing spaces for community gatherings and events, improving air quality, climate resiliency and cooling, and enhancing the overall quality of life for residents; WHEREAS, many parks and green spaces have experienced neglect and underfunding, resulting in deteriorating conditions and limited programming options:

WHEREAS, the 1% for Parks campaign proposes to dedicate one percent of the City's annual budget towards parks and green spaces, ensuring adequate funding for staffing, maintenance, and other critical needs:

WHEREAS, many large U.S. cities allocate more than one percent of their city budgets to parks, which has resulted in significant improvements to parks and green spaces in those communities. San Francisco spends 1.6 percent of its municipal budget on parks, Los Angeles spends 2.9 percent, Chicago 4.3 percent and Minneapolis 5.3 percent.

WHEREAS, the 1% for Parks campaign has garnered widespread support from community organizations, advocacy groups, and residents who recognize the importance of parks and green spaces to the health and well-being of our community;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that State Island Community Board 3 fully supports the 1% for Parks campaign and urges our elected officials to allocate this increased funding in the New York City budget. We believe that investing in parks and green spaces is essential to creating a healthy, vibrant, and sustainable community that benefits all residents.
