
Two-Way Conversion/BBP Temporary Path

Background

- A temporary detour for NB BQE traffic was necessary after portions of the roadway were closed for emergency road work
- Two-way Furman St was proposed in the Downtown Brooklyn Traffic Study and supported by CB 2 in December, 2003 and was included as a circulation improvement measure in the Brooklyn Bridge Park 2005 EIS
- Jersey barriers were installed along Furman St between Montague St and Joralemon St in 2010 to complete a temporary path connecting Brooklyn Bridge Park's Piers 1 and 6
- The intersection of Atlantic Ave, Furman St and Columbia St was redesigned to enhance pedestrian and cyclist access (Brooklyn Waterfront Greenway) to Brooklyn Bridge Park's Pier 6 in 2011

Location

- Furman St Between Joralemon Street and Old Fulton Street
- Brooklyn Bridge Park between Montague and Joralemon Sts
- Piers 1, 2 and 6 parks open to the public
- A temporary path exists within Brooklyn Bridge Park for bikes and pedestrian from Pier 2 to Montague St

Improvements


- One-way to two-way conversion of Furman St between Atlantic Ave and Old Fulton St, removing one lane of southbound traffic
- Marked shoulders on both curbs •

Furman Street (Cont.)

- Relocation of bike and pedestrian path to within Brooklyn Bridge Park between . Montague St and Joralemon St
- Donated fencing, filled pot holes and designed temporary path within park • between Montague St and Joralemon St

Benefits

- Creates a direct vehicular connection from Atlantic Ave to Old Fulton St
- Creates a safer, more pleasant route for bikers and pedestrians .
- Safe, convenient pedestrian and bicycle routes from Pier 1 and 2 to Pier 6 in . **Brooklyn Bridge Park**


