

## 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue and 59<sup>th</sup> Street Vision Zero

- Multi-agency effort to reduce traffic fatalities in NYC
- Borough Action Plans released in 2019
- Priority Intersections, Corridors, and Areas identified for each borough
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Ave at 59<sup>th</sup> St is located in a Vision Zero Priority Area




## **NYC DOT School Safety**

 Part of Vision Zero Initiative to reduce traffic fatalities to zero

DOT School Safety:

- Redesigns streets around schools to improve safety
- Installs school slow zones and manages parking regulations along school frontages



## **Project Area**

- 3<sup>rd</sup> Ave is a local truck route with 9 travel lanes
- Existing school, PS 503/PS 140, on southeast corner of 3<sup>rd</sup> Ave and 59<sup>th</sup> St
- New school, PS 936/MS 939, to open in September 2020
- N/R subway station at 4<sup>th</sup> Ave & 59<sup>th</sup> St




## 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue and 59<sup>th</sup> Street Safety Data

- 1 severe injury
- 60% of injuries occurred between 12 pm and 6 pm
- 33% of injuries caused by read-end collisions


#### Injury Summary, 2013 – 2017 (5 years)

#### **Existing: No Pedestrian Crossings & Dangerous School Bus Loading**




Westbound traffic direction on 59<sup>th</sup> St prevents safe curbside loading of students (typical school buses have right side passenger doors)

No pedestrian crossings at 59<sup>th</sup> St, directly between the new school and subway stop



## **Proposal: Signalized Pedestrian Crossings And School Bus Loading**

Reverse direction of traffic on 59<sup>th</sup> St (2<sup>nd</sup> Ave – 3<sup>rd</sup> Ave) from westbound to eastbound to allow for curbside drop offs



#### **Proposal: examples**

Signalized crossing and concrete medians on 3<sup>rd</sup> Ave at 58<sup>th</sup> St, installed by NYC DOT in 2018

Existing concrete barriers on 3<sup>rd</sup> Ave at 59<sup>th</sup> St
