NYC VCP Cleanup Plan Remedial Activities to Begin

The New York City Office of Environmental Remediation (OER) is providing this Fact Sheet pursuant to the New York City Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP). OER has approved the Remedial Action Work Plan (RAWP) submitted by 156-158 Skillman Corp. for 661 Flushing Avenue, Brooklyn, New York (Block 2272, Lot 54). The remedial work will begin in February 2015. The RAWP can be reviewed electronically or in person at the document repositories identified in the box at left.

Site Description:

The 2,000 square-foot site is currently vacant and undeveloped. The proposed use of the site is a 7-story residential building with a full cellar under the footprint of the building. The first floor will be comprised of residential space with a rear yard.

Summary of the Remedy:

The remedial action for 661 Flushing Avenue is a Track 4 Site-specific Use cleanup. The specific elements of the proposed remedial action include:

- Preparation of a Community Protection Statement and performance of all required NYC VCP citizen participation activities according to an approved Citizen Participation Plan;
- Performance of a Community Air Monitoring Program for particulates and volatile organic carbon compounds;
- Establishment of Track 4 Site-Specific Soil Cleanup Objectives (SCOs);
- Excavation and removal of soil/fill in excess of Track 4 SCOs. For development purposes, the footprint of new building will be excavated to a depth of 6 feet and rear yard area will be excavated to a depth of one foot;
- Transportation and off-site disposal of all soil/fill material at permitted facilities in accordance with applicable laws and regulations;
- Collection and analysis of end-point samples to determine if the remedy attains Track 4 SCOs;
- Installation of a vapor barrier system beneath the building slabs and behind foundation walls of the proposed building;
- Construction and maintenance of an engineered composite cover consisting of 4" concrete basement slab to prevent human exposure to residual soil/fill remaining under the site;
- Submission of a Remedial Action Report (RAR) that describes the remedial activities and certifies that the remedial requirements have been achieved and lists any changes from this RAWP;
- Submission of an approved Site Management Plan (SMP) in the RAR for long-term management of residual contamination, including plans for maintenance, inspection and certification of Engineering and Institutional Controls and reporting at a specified frequency; and
- Continued registration with E-designation for the property.

Cleanup activities are scheduled to begin in February 2015 and are expected take approximately six months to complete.

Next Steps: After the enrollee completes the remedial work, a RAR will be prepared and submitted to OER. The RAR will describe the cleanup activities and certify that all cleanup requirements were met. Once the RAR is approved, OER will issue a Notice of Completion, a City liability release, and a New York City Green Property Certificate. OER will then issue a fact sheet announcing the completion of the remedial action and identify all engineering and institutional controls to be used at the Site.

Figure 1: Site Location




Figure 2: Site Map
