## NYC VCP Cleanup Plan Available for Review and Comment

The New York City Office of Environmental Remediation (OER) provides this Fact Sheet pursuant to New York City's Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP). An application has been submitted by Ms. Angeline Huang for enrollment of the property located at 566 Carroll Street in the Park Slope section of Brooklyn, New York and identified as Block 961, Lot 7 into the VCP. The Remedial Investigation Report (RIR) details the results of an environmental investigation at the site including the nature and extent of contamination. The draft Remedial Action Work Plan (RAWP) proposes remedial actions to address contamination delineated in the RIR.

### Public Comments on the RAWP

OER is accepting public comments on the draft RAWP for 30 days until May 23, 2014. The RIR and draft RAWP are available for review at the document repositories identified in the box on the left including a public library branch and through a link to OER's website. Comments should be sent to Mr. Shaminder Chawla via mail or e-mail (see contact information at left).

### Site Description

The Site is 1,143 square feet and is currently an unpaved vacant lot. The proposed future use of the Site will be a 4-story residential building with a full cellar and rear yard.

### Summary of RIR

The environmental investigation identified several Semi-Volatile Organic Compounds (SVOCs), metals, and pesticides above cleanup guidelines. There were no exceedances found in the groundwater samples. No soil vapor samples were above the monitoring/mitigation level ranges established by the New York State Department of Health.

### Summary of the Remedy

The specific elements of the proposed remedial action include:

- Preparation of a Community Protection Statement and performance of all required NYC VCP Citizen Participation activities according to an approved Citizen Participation Plan;
- Implementation of a Community Air Monitoring Plan for particulates and volatile organic carbon (VOCs) compounds;
- Establishment of Unrestricted Use (Track 1) Soil Cleanup Objectives (SCOs);
- Excavation and removal of soil/fill exceeding Track 1 Unrestricted Use SCOs. The footprint of the new building (2/3<sup>rd</sup> of the property) will be excavated 8 feet below grade and a small rear yard will be excavated to 5 feet depth. Approximately 280 tons of soil will be excavated and removed from Site;
- Transportation and off-Site disposal of all soil/fill material at permitted facilities in accordance with applicable laws and regulations for handling, transport, and disposal, and this plan. Sampling and analysis of excavated media as required by disposal facilities and appropriate segregation of excavated media onsite;
- Implementation of storm-water pollution prevention measures in compliance with applicable laws and regulations;
- Collection and analysis of end-point samples to determine the performance of the remedy with respect to attainment of SCOs;
- Submission of a Remedial Action Report (RAR) that describes the remedial activities and certifies that the remedial requirements have been achieved and lists any changes from this RAWP;

If Track 1 Unrestricted Use cleanup is not achieved, the following construction elements (as part of new development) will be implemented as Engineering and Institutional Controls:

- Installation of a vapor barrier/waterproofing system below the concrete slab underneath the building, as well as behind foundation walls of the proposed building;
- Construction and maintenance of an engineered composite cover consisting of 2" of Mat Slab below the footprint of the new building;
- 2 feet of clean soil/vegetative cover for all open spaces to prevent human exposure to residual soil/fill remaining under the Site;
- Submission of an approved Site Management Plan (SMP) in the RAR for long-term management of residual contamination, including plans for maintenance, inspection and certification of Engineering and Institutional Controls and reporting at a specified frequency; and
- Continued registration with E-designation for the property if Track 1 cleanup is not achieved.

## Next Steps

OER will review the draft RAWP and consider all public comments submitted during the comment period before it approves a final RAWP. The approved RAWP will be placed in the public library branch and on OER's website and a second fact sheet will be issued before remedial work begins.

Figure 1 – Site Location Map




Figure 2 – Site Map
